Our church recently elected a Steering Committee to chart a path forward for our church. So what will they be doing, and what can we all expect?

The world around us has changed radically over the last 50 years, and yet many churches are operating as if it's still the 1980s. And that works fine for the people who have been regularly attending all that time. But for the people we need must, asking them to travel back to the 1980s to meet Jesus is a sure way to fail at our mission from Jesus to make new disciples.

Our church's staffing and ministry strategy needs a "make-over" to get us ready to reach the world that is coming, rather than the one that used to be. But what does that look like? What strategy will help us better connect with people for whom following Jesus and being connected to a church is a totally new experience? trying to reach, what ministry approach will best reach that group of people, and how we need to staff our church in order to carry out that ministry strategy. These are huge decisions, and what they present is likely to look very different from what we've been doing up to this point. Embrace it!

So how can we help them and encourage them in their work? Here are 5 ways to do just that:

- 1. Share your dreams for our church's future with members of the Steering Committee. They value every member of our church and want you to feel engaged in this journey.
- 2. Listen for their regular updates, and ask for clarification if anything is not clear. It will be easier to pray for them if you understand how they are leading us.
- 3. Evaluate their leadership, not by what we've always done, or by what's most comfortable, but by what Christ has called us to

accomplish for His kingdom.

- 4. Thank them for their hard work, even when it challenges you. This process, like any season of change, might stir up a little anxiety. Expect it, and handle it with grace and faith. God is still in charge.
- 5. Don't participate in any gossip about what is being planned or done. Some people can't control their mouths. Don't help them do their damage. If you have questions or concerns, go straight to a member of the Steering Committee and their reports... and insist that others to do the same.

God is about to do a lot of amazing work in and through this First Baptist Church family. A lot of people and families will be transformed by grace! As the church moves forward, I can stand in the road to hinder progress, or I can buckle up for a miraculous and exciting ride. I think I'd rather take the ride than get run over by the movement of God's Spirit!




