#### FIESTA'S "King of Hats", Cal Sumner:

Our April guest speaker Cal Sumner, was the unofficial Fiesta monarch for more than 30 years. His Fiesta legend was built on a black derby hat, which came from the original Broadway production of "Cabaret". It started when Cal "festooned the hat with rhinestones and what he called 'crap off the stage floor' from Cornyation's revival at the Bonham Exchange."<sup>1</sup> One year the hat was decorated to a height of 4 feet. Cal is bringing not only THE HAT but a presentation from his Fiesta collection of more than a thousand Fiesta medals.
