Grace & Peace from the Pastor's Desk

May the God of peace himself sanctify you entirely; and may your spirit and soul and body be kept sound and blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

1 Thessalonians 5:23

Our Thanksgiving holiday is over, and the secular world is well ensconced in the Christmas season... maybe you are too. It's easy to get lost in the shopping, wrapping, cards, decorations and everything else that can be considered the holiday season. However, in the church year, it is the season of Advent, the new beginning of the Christian year, a time of waiting and а time of preparation.

As Christians we live in the now, and the not yet. We straddle the time where Jesus has been born into our world, and the time of his second coming. Advent is that time of preparation for a birth that has taken place over 2000 years ago to be re-imagined and celebrated, and a specific time period set aside for the expectation of a time to come, when our Savior will return, not as an infant born in a humble stable, but claiming his rightful title as King over all creation.

Although this season cries for us to speed up, to make sure everything is ready, to meet the deadlines for parties, celebrations, Christmas Eve and Christmas morning, the true way to celebrate Advent is to take time to slow down, to listen with hope that God has not forgotten us, and that Jesus will come again. We desperately need a God who will restore us and save us. We need to share in the meal that prepares us for Jesus. We need to rejoice together. We need to take time to ponder the promises of God in the way that Mary pondered what it would mean to bring the Son of God into the world.

This year, as we listen to the words of Peter, Paul, Isaiah, Mark, Luke, John, and the psalmists, I invite you to hear the words again, for the first time. Let the message of God's story among humankind reach into your soul, and stir it in a way that brings new life. If you are interested in searching for this other than Sunday mornings, I invite you to a Tuesday evening Bible study to be held at 6:30 pm via Zoom. Please do not let the word Zoom frighten you away. If you like seeing other people's faces and being seen, and have internet access, you can bring us into your home via your computer. If you're the type who wants to remain unseen, or you have no internet connection, all it takes is a phone call to a local number to join in the discussion of the Bible readings for the week. The readings, Zoom information, and the phone number will be published weekly, prior to the study, which will begin November 24. There will be no book to study, just a reading of the texts (which can be done prior to the meeting, but there is no requirement to do so).

Know that I am available to you by a scheduled or drop-in visit to the office on Tuesday and Thursday mornings; by phoning 833-7062 during office hours; or by leaving a message on my cell phone (724-557-2386), and I will call you back. Have a happy and reflective Advent season!



Sharing this article from the SWPA Synod Green Team and the ELCA This Christmas is likely to be very different for us. With that in mind, perhaps consider starting some new traditions this year with a focus on environmentally friendly gifts and activities or a reduction in the number of gifts. There are lots of ideas, here are a few to consider:

- Make donations to charitable organizations in honor of family and friends (consider ELCA.org/goodgifts)
- Contact businesses in towns where extended family and friends live and order gift cards to be sent to you in time to then mail them back to your gift recipients.
- Limit use of non-compostable or non-recyclable wrapping paper. Use newspaper, plain brown packing paper (have kiddos decorate) or even useful items like towels, scarves or small blankets instead.
- Offer the gift of time and talent instead of purchasing something (are you a handy-person, a baker, a gardener, a window washer, etc.) A home-made gift card offering x hours of your skill or x meals from you might mean more than something you buy at a store.
- Put together an album of photos of you and your family to share with relatives. That can be done through various sharing mechanisms online where access is limited by links or named people only.
- If you have adult (or nearly so) children and/or grandchildren, make them a memory book of events from your life they may not know (include old photos, stories - did you get into trouble at school for something, favorite recipes, bible verses, etc.). It will be something they will cherish for years.
- If you really want to give physical gifts, consider things that can be good for the environment (e.g. solar powered items like outdoor path lighting, phone chargers, flashlights, etc. or reusable items as stocking stuffers - grocery bags, filtered water bottles, "waxed" papers, cloth napkins, etc.)

Call the church office at 833-4062, if there must be a permanent change.

Each weekly offering must be counted and tallied separately using separate worksheet and cover sheet paperwork for that week. A separate deposit slip for each week should be processed as well, so that the bank records will correspond to our records. Money total and envelope total must be equal. *Make sure there is a readable amount on each envelope and that it equals the amount in the envelope.* ****Write down the name – amount – what for – on a piece of paper if check is not in an envelope or a non-numbered envelope.* If an error cannot be found, make a note of the amount. No figures are to be changed by the counters!

List those paying for altar flowers and send to office. A separate list of memorials, Easter and Christmas flowers must be given to the office for the bulletins.

Supplies are ordered only through the office! Extras are on the bottom shelf of the counter's cabinet. When night deposit bags are low and deposit slips are low notify the church office. These will be ordered by the secretary or John Siefert (treasurer).
