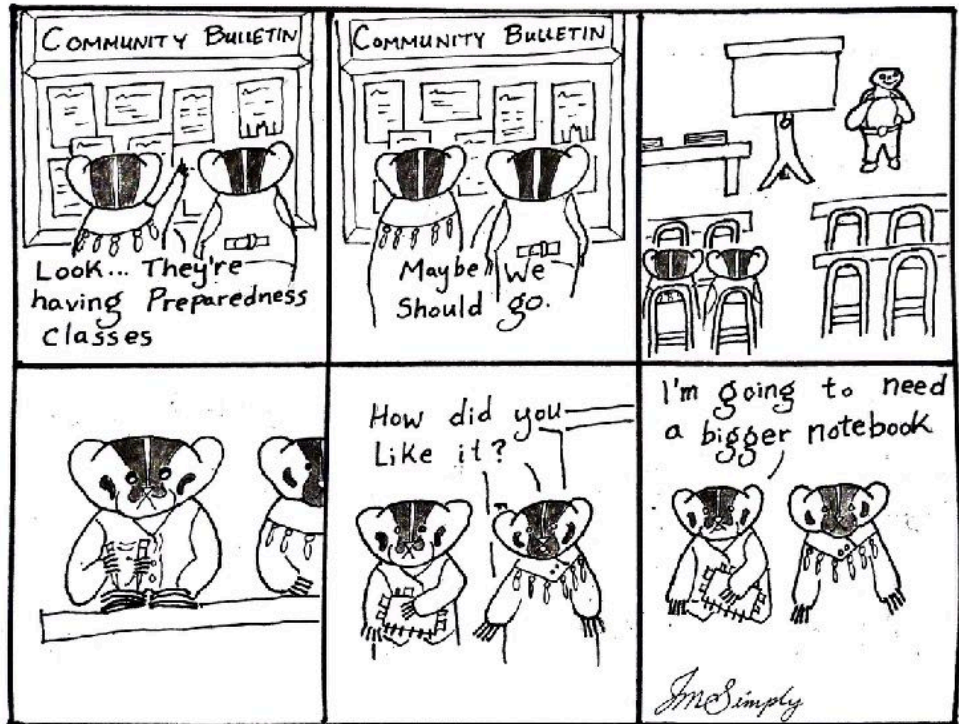
Looking for Local Artists & Craft-Persons for Future Craft Markets at the Dolan Springs Community Center (DSCC).

Clearview Ranch Enchilada Dinner**Ingredients**

3 pounds chicken -- cubed into bite size pieces
1 tablespoon olive oil
8 ounces cream cheese -- softened
7 ounces green chiles -- diced, drained
12 medium flour tortillas
20 ounces salsa -- or green enchilada sauce (mild is better)
4 cups shredded Colby-Jack cheese -- (enough to cover pan)

**Directions:**

Preheat oven to 350 F. Grease a 9 x 12 inch pan (or larger if making extra).
Cook chicken over medium heat in oil until done. Mix together cream cheese and drained chiles, and add to chicken; cook over low heat until cheese is melted, stirring to mix.
Remove from heat and place spoonfuls of mixture into tortillas and roll up; lay rolls into pan side by side. The pan should be crowded when done.
Pour salsa or enchilada sauce over tortillas. Sprinkle cheese over top of sauce, and if storing overnight or freezing, cover with plastic wrap and then foil.
Bake uncovered, thawed pan at 350 F for about 20 minutes or until cheese is melted and lightly browned.
Serve with a fresh green salad, crisp tortilla corn chips, a good salsa, and guacamole.

NOTES : I used cooked chicken - about 3 cups. Heated up in a saucepan and added the cream cheese etc.

Also added a can of drained whole kernel corn with the cream cheese. Turned out very good.

This year it is also a supermoon, because it is closer than usual to the earth. I only used my camera phone, so the detail isn't the best.

From a site called Greenmatters, I learned it has also been called a Rose, Mead, Honey, Hoe, Flower, Hot, and Planting Moon

we sure got shorted on the wildflowers this spring. But these carnations that I had planted last year came back and made me very happy to see them. I might have a new favorite for the garden. You can see the walking or Egyptian onions in the front. If you pick the bulbs off the stalks and plant them.

They look like Martian onions to me.

Did You Know-about Columbine Falls? When the level of the lake is high it is an easy boat ride about a mile east of where Pierce Ferry reaches the river. These days it is a long hike no matter which way you try it. The falls are at the end of Cave Canyon which begins up on the Grand Wash Cliffs east of Meadview, and winds and twists through ever deepening walls. If you come that way you might discover how it got its name. A shorter route would be from the end of Pierce Ferry Rd, and along the shoreline. Shorter, but not short. I've heard there is a trail, aptly named Secret Trail, that has recently been cut over from Pierce Ferry Rd two miles from the river, but I can't find much information on it. The falls were once called Emery falls after the man who lived on a house boat at the end of Pierce Ferry and sold fish bait and snack for the new boaters on Lake Mead in the 1930's and '40's.
