


Pastoral visits and home communions are available anytime. Please call the office.

A Brief Look At Some Summer Hill History By Harry Schwenk

In continuing from last month's newsletter, here are more letters that were sent to our church from our members who were serving our country during World War II

From:

Pfc. George Fessler, France-I have been through a lot of towns, but didn't see any as badly demolished as St. Lo. I don't believe there is one home standing in the whole town. It is flattened to the ground. The French people are friendly, but I feel lost as I can't understand their language. Once in a while we meet one that can speak English. I enjoy receiving the Messenger from the church.

Sgt. Lamar Heim, Woodrow Wilson Hospital, Virginia-I am sure glad to be back in the States. I had many experiences that I will never forget. I am getting along nicely. (Lamar was wounded in the left arm, and at this writing is at home on a furlough.)

Pfc. Warren Heim, France-My mail has been delayed; however, I received the Messenger and was certainly glad to receive it. Newspapers are very scarce and we get very little news except the highlights that our officers give us.

Pvt. Carl Haller, New Guinea-We get very good food here, and I like the place. We are kept very busy.

Robert Morbauch, S1/c, South Pacific-We are kept on the move continually. Received the Christmas box from the church, and I want to thank the members of St. Paul's for their thoughtfulness in sending us these boxes. Also, for the Assistant Pastor and the Messenger. Thanks a lot.

Pfc. Eugene Moyer, England-The churches and homes in this locality are all built of stone or brick and make a good appearance. I attend church services over here. The church services are well attended by the soldiers.

Pvt. Earl Moyer, Blytheville, Arkansas-Most of my work is on B-25s and get many plane rides. We just came back from a hop to Turner Field, GA. Our shifts are 12 hours, and for the past few weeks, I worked as high as 18 hours a day.

Pfc. Carl Moyer, New Guinea-It is very hot here and there aren't many places to go. We spend most of our time off at the Red Cross, listening to the radio and playing the phonograph. We also do most of our letter writing there.

Pvt. Marlin Moyer, Italy-I am always glad to hear from you and to receive the Assistant Pastor and monthly Messenger. I have seen action, plenty, and a fellow sure does a lot of praying when he is in the front lines. When you see your buddies fall, a person doesn't feel as good.

Worship in Collaboration with Oglala Sioux Nation

On November 12, 2023, St. Mark's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Birdsboro, PA, held their annual Native American worship service in honor of November being Native American Heritage Month. I attended the worship service and wanted to share my experience with you.

St. Mark's Lutheran Church has a partnership with the Oglala Sioux Nation of Native Americans in Pine Ridge Reservation, South Dakota, one of the poorest communities in the United States, and has been supporting them in many ways with their giving and their prayers.

In the worship service, the English translations used for the liturgy were:

Creator as the name used for God


Creator-Sets-Free as the name used for Jesus

The Chosen One as the name used for Christ

The Great Spirit as the name used for the Holy Spirit

The music for the worship service had a Native American vibe, words, and theme involving the sacredness of nature and life.

Copal incense from Central and Southwestern North America was used during the service as Native Americans used for sacred services.





Pr. Jim Farnsworth's message was dedicated to Native Americans and how the new immigrants treated them to America. He asked that we remember and honor those who have gone before us — the original inhabitants of this land. He also asked that we have a right relationship with God and each other and that we have a responsibility to repair relations. We reconcile by learning the truth, loving each other, and breaking down barriers with others. He suggested that we learn the history of our area by looking through the eyes of our neighbors and that we are called to be good neighbors.
