PTP scholarship and grant awarded

Our PTP chapter is pleased to announce the two winners of our chapter scholarship and the new grant for overseas study, both of which were made possible because of a bequest from the Bob and Lorraine Beaver estate.

Nat Werth is the first high school senior to receive the scholarship, and Molly Zenk is the first college student to receive the grant for overseas study next year. Nat received the good news at the May PTP meeting at the Elks Club, and Molly will be awarded her grant at the chapter picnic on August 8.

Nat was one of the most outstanding exchange students on both the short and the long term exchanges with Esslingen. His exchange partner has come back to visit, and this summer Nat will return to Esslingen to spend time with Joern's family. He is also an Eagle Scout, had the lead in the spring musical at Lutheran High, and he was valedictorian of his class. In his application for the scholarship, Nat wrote "...in a blog post, I talked about how Joern's grandmother (Oma) would ceaselessly chatter at me, regardless of my comprehension. By the end of my time in Germany, we were able to chatter together about her childhood, my family, or daily items like Stuttgart's traffic problems. Thanks to the persistence and hospitality that Joern's family showed me, I will never forget that I have a family in Germany."

Nat will continue his education at Northeastern University in Boston this fall. He will receive a total of \$2500 from People to People-Sheboygan over the first two years of college. He is pictured

Molly Zenk will study in Germany

Molly Zenk is the first recipient of a \$1500 grant available to past PTP exchange students who plan to study abroad for a semester or an academic year. Molly is attending Iowa State University and will be spending the next year studying in Marburg,

Germany. She has been on the Dean's List for her first three semesters at ISU, where she is also in the German Club, the Golden Key International Honor Society, the Cantamus Choir, and is involved in a nonprofit protégé program.



This past May she spent two weeks on a mission trip to Vietnam.

Molly took part in the short term exchange program in the summer of 2013 and spent the spring semester in Esslingen, Germany, in 2015.

In her application for the grant, Molly wrote, "I have a fascination with other people and cultures. Studying abroad in Germany has been a huge part in fueling this interest. From as early as my middle school exchange, I've had the chance to immerse myself in a different culture....This coming year I will be studying abroad in Marburg, Germany. I am so excited to return to Germany. The people and culture have been so significant in my life. I look forward to the new challenges that returning will bring. I have never been abroad for a year, and I will no longer live with a host family. These challenges will require a new level of independence and self sufficiency....I am so grateful for the ways People to People exchanges have changed my life, and I am so excited to see how my future trips abroad continue to challenge me and spur growth."

Molly is the daughter of Joe and Renee Zenk, both of whom have been active in the chapter for a number of years. Renee was the chaperone for the middle school students last summer, and Joe serves on the PTP board of directors. They have had several children participate in both of our exchange programs.
