does this at Christmas also.

Steve said, the Homeless need

a little bit extra where it is cold, so lets take the food to them now instead
of waiting until April 2nd.





Save-a-Lot ask their customers if they would like to buy a bag of food for the Homeless... So we just tell people....go down to Save-a-Lot, buy a bag of food for \$6 it goes to the homeless. So after 2 weeks of shoppers purchasing these bags of food for \$6 each there were 180 bags delivered to the Homeless Shelter.



Our Case Managers were there for any help or support needed.

Save-a-Lot 21st Annual Race Day, April 2nd from 12pm to 4pm at Perry County Central High School. Last year they raised \$17,000. This year we hope to break \$20 thousand.

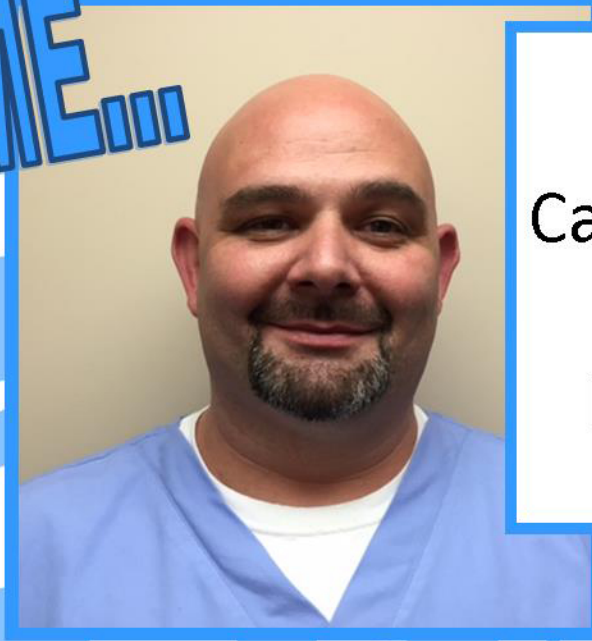

SecondChance Mission (Summit Community Church) located at 441 E. Main Street, exists to provide help to low income families in Perry Co. These vouchers will allow families to shop for their needs in the store. All first time voucher applicants will need a proof of income/benefits. Individuals that do not qualify for our low income vouchers can still shop the store, with limit, for a monetary donation. These donations will be used to keep the store stocked with diapers, cleaning products, school supplies, etc.

Clothing/Item donations will be accepted during business hours, as this store is ran solely on donations from the community. Donations must be gently used, no holes or stains, please. Also, we have a "next size up" exchange! Bring in your kids outgrown clothing and exchange it for the next size up! All employees of SecondChance Mission are volunteers!

Hazard Rural Health Summit

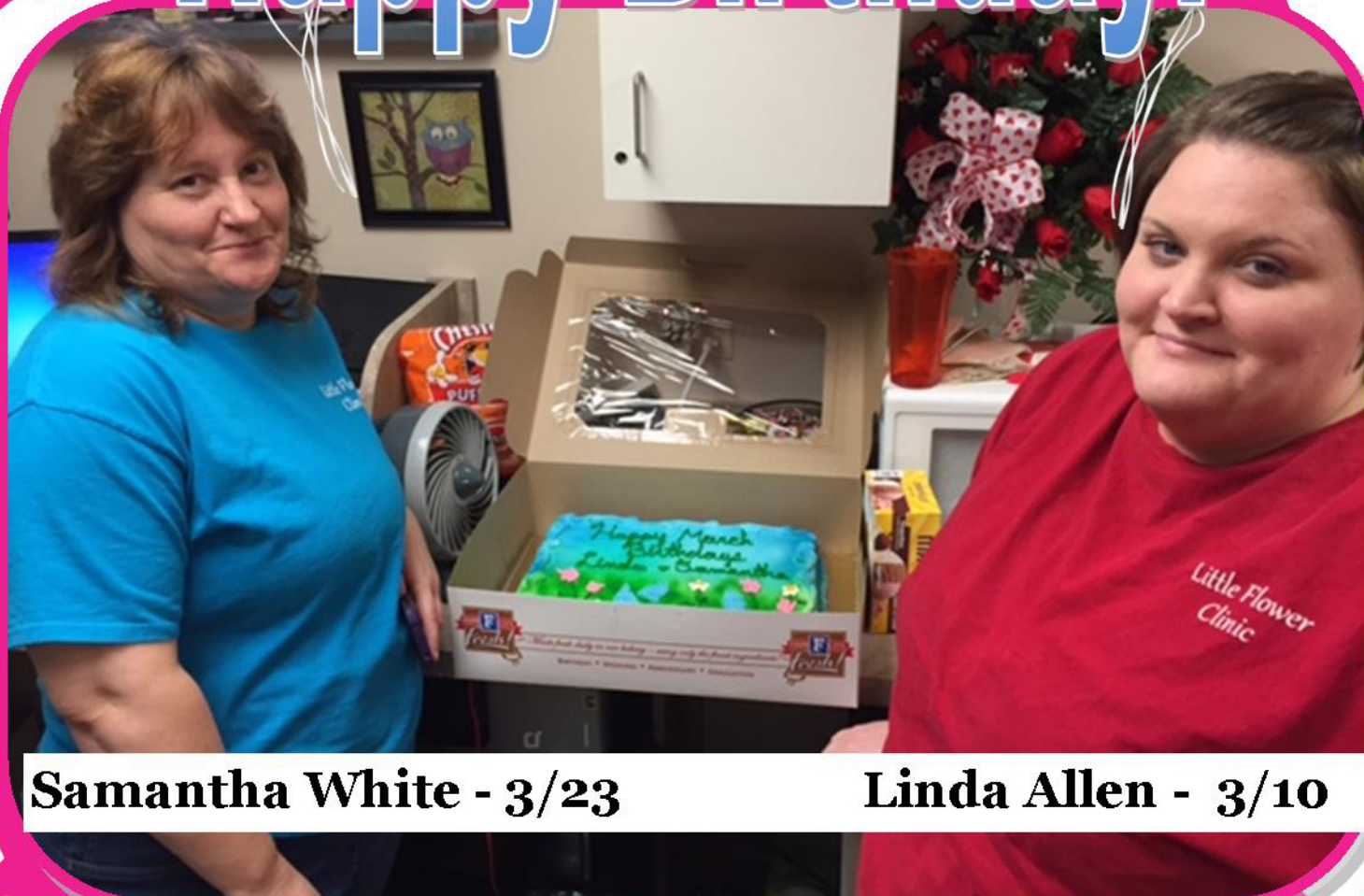
