I settled in Sula and was blessed to be taken under the wings of so many honest, hard working people. Feeling akin to the land, Ag is near and dear to my heart and I support ranchers and the ranching life style 100%.

In 1994 I moved onto the property where I currently reside, in Charlos Heights. That's where my education in conservatism really began. Living within my means has always been important to me and I was raised with the philosophy that if I couldn't provide it for myself, I simply didn't need it. I spent the next 12 years single, building my facility, my horsemanship skills and my business.
