



Thirty Parkside Super Seniors gathered for their May 29th meeting in the Fellowship Area. Dr. Suzanne McDonald, Professor of Historical and Systematic heology at Western Theological Seminary in Holland, was the special guest speaker. Her presentation was entitled **Dealing Faithfully**

with Dementia. She reviewed a brief history and the prevalence of dementia over recent years. Suzanne than picked up the theme of Holy Saturday, the day between the crucifixion and resurrection, and how the disciples reacted to Jesus' death. It illustrated how their reactions

can teach people how that period mirrors those suffering with dementia. The reactions the disciples displayed also apply to
