Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches, 1st Sunday Advent Year C Lk 21:25-28, 34-36

"There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars" (Luke 21:25). What a year we have had, with sights in the sky. Back on April we had a Solar Eclipse (totality here), then a lunar eclipse on September 17, the Comet Tsuchinshan-ATLAS passed us visibly on October 12 (it loops around the sun only once in every 80,000 years), and we had a unique year full of various meteor showers (Lyrid-April 21-22, Perseids August 12-13, Orionids October 21-22 & watch for it- the Geminid Showers December 13-14!) But speaking of 'fright' 'dismay' and 'perplexity' the only celestial event that may have raised a concerned eyebrow of a veteran skywatcher, may have been the July 4th passage of an asteroid called (415029) 2011 UL21— whizzing close to earth 17 times farther out than our moon, but still, at 7,600 feet long, it was one of the largest to come that close in the past 125 years (extinction level event). Yet, before we feel anything other than admiration and awe at God's creative will in designing our complex universe (Psalm 19), we need to remember that we are made from God's hands too – the God who made the sun, stars and sky is the same God who created us and became one with us to redeem and save us. So, when we hear all kinds of popular 'end of days' talk, we disciples of Jesus should not fear. In fact, Jesus advised us "Do not be alarmed" (Mark 13:7) or in today's gospel Jesus says, "when these signs begin to happen, stand upright and raise your heads, because your redemption is at hand" (Luke 21:28). Keeping close to Jesus, these stellar spectacles are no worry for us. They actually inspire greater trust in God!

This First Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of a new liturgical year (Year C-Year of Luke). I emphasize every year that as we near the end of the liturgical year- last week ended the church year with the Feast of Christ the King (Jesus is All in All - Alpha and Omega!) - the last few weeks' readings always sound off ominous calls about the end of times. This theme continues one Sunday more into the new year on the first Sunday of Advent, as if to remind us to be more appreciative of every new day! It is like they are saying, "If you made it through and are reading this now, then you survived, so how are you going to be different and express that gratitude now- Get to it!" Wake-up!

So, welcome to the first day of the rest of your life. How will we spend the new coming year-the time we have been given? The season of Advent is a time of preparation for celebrating Jesus' birth: His continuing birth among us!

How will we prepare for welcoming Jesus into our lives and world anew at Christmas? Advent presents a four week training period, for us to cultivate a spirit of expectation, similar to the spirit of watchful anticipation that many, many generations of Hebrew people experienced awaiting faithfully for the Messiah's coming, foretold by all the prophets. They waited a long, long time! Yet they never gave up watching. How can we spend our four weeks of Advent, showing such fidelity in anticipating Christ's return?

Luke's gospel helps us! Our new liturgical year of reading Luke encourages us to study his unique approach to sharing the Good News of Jesus. Each gospel has a unique perspective, which can be seen in the style, language and detail with which they tell us about the events in the life of Jesus and the apostles. We will be continuously (Sunday after Sunday) reading through the gospel of Luke (Year C) in our three-year lectionary reading cycle. I know this raises the question in a lot of minds: Three? Wait, there are four gospels, why only a three year cycle? Well, Matthew, Mark and Luke are very similar in their timelines and layout, and are easily paralleled on to a year-long progressive reading, whereas John's gospel stands alone as unique in its symbolic number of only seven miracles along with additional extended discourses of Jesus, that are not easily broken up to make a full year's reading cycle. Also, John is unique with his level of theological development, so the Church reserves his work for special occasions in the year such as during the Christmas and Easter seasons (some people refer to John's gospel as the most theologically elaborate or deeply thoughtthrough in its presentation of Jesus' teaching and miracles-which makes sense when we consider that it was the last gospel written). We are thankful for such a wide-reading of all the gospels through the whole three year cycle. Catholics read a lot of scripture, Mass after Mass in our year. According to the Jesuit Scripture Scholar Fr Felix Just, our Sunday and weekday Lectionaries contain 89.8 percent of the Gospels and 54.9 percent of the other New Testament letters and writings. So, after attending masses every Sunday for three years, a person can claim to have heard/read nearly 90 percent of the gospels! That is some accomplishment; by just participating in Mass each week!
