White Asparagus (Weisser Spargel)

— A symbolic ceremony digging out of the first white asparagus plants at the beginning of April officially opens asparagus season in Bavaria. The tasty and healthy vegetable, considered a delicatessen in North America, is on sale everywhere in the Land until the end of June!

1 bunch of white asparagus pan of lightly salted boiling water buttered bread crumbs

white sauce (using the cooking water-optional)

White asparagus requires peeling whether the stalks are thick or thin. The cut ends should be light colored and moist. The stalks ought to be firm with no bruises. Wash and peel and cut about 1 inch from the base ends. Don't damage the tips. Place them horizontally in a skillet or pan filled with lightly salted water and bring to a boil. Simmer for 12–14 minutes. Carefully remove the spears and drain. It is best to top with buttered bread crumbs, or make a white sauce by using the liquid they were cooked in. If you are not cooking the asparagus right away, wrap them in a clean damp paper towel and place in a plastic bag and refrigerate in the vegetable compartment.

NOTE: Germany is famous for its white asparagus. In our supermarkets, it is available in the springtime and in the fall because it is also grown in Peru which has spring during our fall.

Retired Pope Benedict Celebrates 90th Birthday in German Style

A bit of Bavaria, including German beer and pretzels, came to the Vatican to help celebrate retired Pope Benedict XVI's 90th birthday.

"Thank you for bringing Bavaria here," he told his guests, commenting on the beauty of gathering together under a blue Roman sky with white clouds—colors that "recall the white and blue flag of Bavaria" and how "it's always the same sky" no matter where one finds oneself in the world.

The Bavarian-born pope's birthday fell on Easter Sunday, April 16, so a small informal party was held April 17 outside his residence, the Mater Ecclesiae Monastery in the Vatican gardens.

Pope Francis visited his predecessor April 12, before the start of the Easter Triduum, to offer him birthday greetings.

Special guests at the Bavarian party included: Msgr. Georg Ratzinger, the retired pope's 93-year-old brother; Archbishop Georg Ganswein, the retired pope's personal secretary; Birgit Wansing, a longtime administrative assistant; and the consecrated laywomen from Memores Domini, who assist him.

A German delegation was present, led by the minister president of Bavaria, Horst Seehofer, and including a group of men dressed in the traditional uniforms of the "Schutzen" with their dark green wool hats decorated with feathers, pins and springs of greenery.

Pope Benedict said his heart was filled with gratitude "for the 90 years the good Lord has given me. There have been trying and difficult times, but he always guided me and pulled me through."

He thanked God for his beautiful homeland "that you now bring to me," and which is "open to the world, lively and happy" because it is rooted so deeply in the Christian faith.





As we look forward to the upcoming 4 day Gaufest hosted by our friends at SGTV Edelweiss Buffalo. some of you may be asking what exactly is a "Gaufest" and where did the tradition start? Here's a little info on what it is and how it came to be.

The word "Gau" itself is an old germanic word that basically means "territory", "neighborhood" or "land". The division of Germany during the middle ages into "Gaus" under the then living counts was when we first encounter this word in history. The more commonly known version is its use during World War II under the Nazi party when Germany was again divided up into "Gaus" and each area was represented by a "Gauleiter". Today the term "Gau" is found in town names (Schongau, Oberammergau), regional names (Pongau, Pinzgau, Allgaü), and in regional club groups like German Boy Scouts, Schützenverbände or Trachtenverbände like our own "Gauverband Nordamerika".

The beginning of the 19th century saw an increased interest in local "Tracht" or clothing in Bavaria and the first forerunner of our present day "Trachtenverein" was founded in 1859. The "Gesellschaft Gemütlichkeit von 1859" in Miesbach was the club that led to the formation of the "Trachtenvereins Miesbach" in 1884. (The black and white photo depicted here, dating back to 1862, is the oldest historical photo of any Trachtengroup.) In 1890, the "Gauverband I" was formed as an umbrella organization to the then



existing Trachtengroups. As years went by and more groups were formed, more "Gauverbände" were founded as umbrella organizations. To date there are 24 Gaus and over 980 Trachtenvereins worldwide.



The "Gautrachtenfest" or "Gaufest" is the highpoint of every Plattler and his Verein. It is celebrated yearly in Bavaria in every Gauverband. As a rule, a huge beer tent is erected for the fest. The "Gaufest" of the Gauverband I is the largest yearly fest with over 8000 Schuhplattlers taking part (color photo above). Most of the Gaufests last 2 days or more. They normally begin with a mass followed by an "Umzug" or parade of the different clubs. Then there are various activities most notably dancing for prizes as well as normal dances for spectator enjoyment all within the confines of the beer tent. Our Gaufest takes place every 2 years because of how spread out around

America and Canada we are. All the more reason to have double the fun there!






"Goodbye Lenin" -- May 9, 2107 —Legion Hall


