

GUILD HISTORY


In November, 1983, a group of quilters took a class, "Christmas Quilt," at a shop called Needlecrafters, which was located on Pomfret Street in Carlisle. They already thought there was interest in starting a quilt guild, and this is a photo of the original sign-up sheet that was circulated during that class for those interested in organizing what became the LeTort Quilters. The group met in the spring of 1984 with Deb Tucker (yes, the one of ruler fame) as the first president.

The Letort Quilters was first established as the Carlisle chapter of the National Quilting Association (NQA). In the last 40 years, there have been many changes, many activities, and a lot of quilts made. As this year, 2024, marks the 40th anniversary of our founding, we will be highlighting some of the people, events, and activities that have given us the vibrant group we have today.

We are fortunate to have two scrapbooks that document our early history, but after 2013, our records are pretty sketchy. If anyone is interested in helping to document our last 10 years we could use a small group of folks who would like to pull together our more recent history.

We would also love to hear from those of you who have memories to share about the early days of the guild.
