May the Holy Spirit continue strengthening our faith journey as we grow in the grace and knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ. May God grant us the grace to enjoy the wonders of each day, pray without ceasing for each other, and for God's will to be done on earth as it is in heaven.

# The peace of Christ belongs to everyone, everywhere

#### World Communion Sunday

Sunday, October 1st, 2023

#### "All who eat and drink without discerning the body, eat and drink judgment against themselves." (I Cor. 11:29)

The first Sunday in October is designated as World Communion Sunday, which celebrates our oneness in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the world. Paul tells us that we are to "discern the body" when we partake of Holy Communion, mindful that we note our relationship to all our brothers and sisters in Christ in the celebration. One is not to go hungry while another is drunk! (I Cor. 11:21). This is scandalous behavior opposed to the Way of Christ. Thus it is appropriate that World Communion Sunday is also a time when we receive the annual Peace and Global Witness Offering as a way of continuing the ancient Christian practice of sharing what we have with brothers and sisters in need.

World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical church. The first celebration occurred at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1933.

Indigenous Peoples Day and Columbus Day October 9, 2023



#### **Columbus** Day

Columbus Day is a federal U.S. holiday commemorating the voyage and landing of Italian explorer Christopher Columbus in the "New World" on October 12, 1492.

Columbus landed on a small island in the Bahamas, convinced that he had reached his destination of Asia. Although he was not the first European to come across the Americas, his journey sparked enthusiasm for European exploration of the hemisphere. It kicked off a significant connection between the Old World and the New World.

#### Indigenous Peoples' Day

Some locations in the United States honor Native American culture on the second Monday in October with a holiday called Indigenous Peoples' Day. Since the late 1980s, this day has been celebrated instead of or alongside Columbus Day.

The purpose of Indigenous Peoples' Day is not to erase Columbus Day from history but rather to recognize, honor, and celebrate the Native American cultures and people who have inhabited the Americas since long before European explorers arrived.

#### **Columbus Day Controversy**

Although Columbus' landing in the New World marked the start of a new age of exploration and development for the world, the reality of European colonization is that it brought disease, enslavement, and genocide to the indigenous people of the Americas. This part of colonial history has largely been overlooked in Columbus Day celebrations. However, this has been changing in recent decades, with more and more cities and states choosing to celebrate Indigenous Peoples' Day instead.



#### **REFORMATION SUNDAY 2023: OCTOBER 29TH**

Presbyterians celebrate the tradition that grounds their faith on Reformation Sunday. It is always the last Sunday in October, marking the occasion in 1517 when Martin Luther posted his 95 theses on the church door in Wittenberg, Germany.

#### 1963: A Year of Reform

On July 4, 1963, Stated Clerk of the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. (UPCUSA) Rev. Eugene Carson Blake and African American Elder Furman Templeton approached Gwynn Oaks Amusement Park in Baltimore. The pair, along with other civil rights activists, were arrested for trespassing. <u>Download this year's</u> <u>church bulletin insert</u> (or go to <u>https://bit.ly/48AsMi8</u>) that explores 1963 as a year of reform within the Presbyterian Church.

"The churches have long pronounced, and they've said it ever since the New Testament was written, that we're for a non-segregated church and a non-segregated society—but it's been mostly talk. And during this year of 1963 it's clear that this crisis is a national crisis and that the pattern, the segregated pattern of life needs to be broken."

#### Reformation Day 2023 - October 31, 2023 in the World

With Reformation Day on October 31, 2023 Protestants and Lutherans commemorate the placarding of Martin Luther's 95 propositions in 1517. Reformation Day is on the same date as Halloween but has nothing to do with it. In Germany this is an official holiday in the evangelic parts of the country. People believe that Martin Luther placarded his thesis about church on the All Saints Church in Wittenberg in Eastern Germany. Since 1938 this city is called Lutherstadt Wittenberg, which means City of Luther.

In his 95 thesis Luther demanded a critical answering of religious questions - very close to the bible. He translated the bible from Latin into German and so made sure that everyone could read it. He did not really plan to reform the church system but his Lutheran Bible was the hour of birth for Protestants and other evangelic Christians. The Reformation took place from 1517 until 1555 and finally split the Christian church into catholic, protestant and Lutheran Christians.



# CHILDREN'S CORNER

# Moses Gets Water From a Rock

Theme: God can do impossible things.

**Object:** Small rock, blank piece of paper, scissors

Scripture: Exodus 17:5-6



How many of you have ever played the game Rock, Paper, Scissors? Here's how to play Rock, Paper, Scissors. Follow along. Demonstrate the motions as you explain.

Players all hold one hand out as a platform and hit it with their other fist while saying, "Rock, Paper, Scissors... go!" On the fourth hit and the word "go," players form either a rock, paper, or scissors. Demonstrate each item as you say the words.

This is how you know who wins: rock smashes scissors, paper covers a rock, and scissors cut paper.

Let's play! You can all play against me and you can keep track of how many times you win. Ready? One, two, three, go. For the first round, choose a rock.

I made a rock. If you made paper, you win. If you made scissors, I win. If you made a rock, we tied. Play several rounds.

The great thing about Rock, Paper, Scissors is that you can be a winner no matter what you choose from game to game. Today, I have a real rock, paper, and scissors with me. These items are all useful in their own way. Hold up each item as you talk about it. If you wanted to write a letter, a rock or scissors wouldn't be much help, but a piece of paper would be, wouldn't it? If you wanted to cut a piece of paper, a rock or paper wouldn't help, but a pair of scissors would. If you were really thirsty and needed a drink of water, a piece of paper or a pair of scissors wouldn't be much help, but a rock might be exactly what you need.

#### Wait-what?

Some of you are looking at me like I'm crazy! Don't you think a rock would be helpful if you needed a drink of water? Let's vote. Have kids raise their hand if they think a rock would help or not if a person needed water.

Well, in our Bible lesson today, that's exactly what happened: A rock helped when people were thirsty.

What's it like when you feel very, very thirsty? Let a few kids respond. Being thirsty is uncomfortable. It can give you a headache and make you dizzy. In fact, the human body has to have water every day, multiple times a day to stay alive.

Moses had led the Israelites out of slavery into the desert. The Israelites were more and more thirsty, the situation was getting very serious, and they complained to Moses. So Moses went to his tent and fell on his knees before God.

God answered and Moses did exactly what God told him to do. After he struck the rock, water began rushing from it—enough to quench the thirst of all the people and all their animals!

We can learn a lot from Moses. When you and I face an impossible situation, we can go to God and ask for His help. God can do impossible things.

#### **PRAYER:**

Dear God, when we face impossible situations, help us remember Moses and know that we serve a God who can get water from a rock. In Jesus' name, amen.
