

Sanborn Tenney McGraw II

Sanborn Tenney McGraw II, 85, of Port Austin, and Ophelia, Va., died March 30, 2014 in Virginia.

He was born March 6, 1929, in Detroit, the son of Dickenson and Alice P. McGraw. A 1946 graduate of Cranbrook School and 1950 graduate of Wayne State University, he spent most of his professional life in banking.

Although much of his life was spent in the Detroit area, the place he loved the best was the "Thumb" of Michigan. For 82 years, "Tenney" spent part of every summer in the lakeside community of Broken Rocks. It gave him great delight that his children and grandchildren shared his love of Broken Rocks, and all of Huron County.

In 1997, after his retirement from banking, S. Tenney McGraw was asked to serve as the founding executive director of the Huron County Community Foundation, a position he regarded as his most important work. The Foundation provides educational scholarships and supports many philanthropic efforts throughout Huron County. He led the effort to take a \$1000 initial donation and raise \$400,000 in additional monies in order to receive a matching grant from the Kellogg Foundation.
