




Our Purpose and Objectives

- To increase access to social services and counseling services.
- To increase access to youth programming.
- To partner with existing stakeholders such as the school district and Shippensburg University to meet educational and community needs.

The SCRC was started in 2010 in response to the growing need to help residents find and utilize social services. Shippensburg falls between the counties of Franklin and Cumberland which means that services can be difficult for community members to access if the services extend to Shippensburg at all. The Resource Coalition has brought service providers and community members together since this time, with the aim of connecting clients with resources as well as developing programs to meet needs.

The SCRC is a Shippensburg University Center For Excellence and serves as a "learning lab" for the university. Students, Faculty, and staff are involved in our work and have initiated many of our programs and services. We also provide a bridge for building community-university relationships. The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings w/your children

Here at our parish, we are transitioning away

from Children's Liturgy of the Word during the Mass, and instead, we would like to encourage parents to discuss the weekly readings or homily with their children either before or after Mass occurs. This spiritual conversation, even if it is simple or a bit scattered, can be very powerful, and it is a way for God's word to come alive in our hearts. We will provide questions and discussion points to help parents start this conversation with their children, and please consider doing this with your family each week!

Jesus talks about wisdom. He reminded his disciples of "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth." It meant if someone harmed you, you could expect that person to pay you back for what had been harmed. However, you could only harm them back equally as much as you were hurt and no more. This rule keeps an argument from getting worse and prevents the harm to each person from getting worse.

Does that sound fair?



Jesus also reminded his disciples that "you shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy." The wisdom of the world tells us

that this makes sense to hate those who want to hurt you. But God's wisdom is not the wisdom of the world. We know that God loves and care for all people. Jesus gave us a new rule: "love your enemies" and "pray for those who persecute you." This is not easy at all. We have trouble liking someone who has hurt us. When someone has hurt us, we should remember to pray to God that the person's heart could change. We don't have to agree with what they are doing, but we can ask God to show them his love. Maybe they wouldn't treat others so unfairly if they knew and felt God's love for them.

God's wisdom is about uniting people into one community of love.

Living our Faith: How many times can you "turn the other cheek" (pray for those who have hurt you) this week to show love for your enemies?




