- 1. Assign someone other than the coaching staff or umpires (because of their other responsibilities) to monitor local weather conditions before and during practices and contests using all technology available.
- 2. Designate those who have the authority to implement suspension of play and evacuation.
- ${\bf 3.}\ Develop\ an\ evacuation\ plan,\ including\ identification\ of\ appropriate\ nearby\ safe\ areas.$

Suggestions:

- a. An enclosed building (not a dugout or covered stands)
- b. A hard top vehicle with windows closed
- 4. Develop criteria for suspension and resumption of play.
- a. When thunder is heard or a cloud-to-ground lightning bolt is seen, the leading edge of the thunderstorm is close enough to strike your location with lightning. If there are 30 seconds or less between the flash of lightning and the bang of thunder or a weather device gives notification that lightning has been detected 5 or less miles away from the location of the game or practice, suspend play and take shelter immediately.
- b. Thirty-minute rule. Once play has been suspended, wait at least 30 minutes after the last thunder is heard or flash of lightning is witnessed or a weather device gives notification that lightning is no longer within a 5 mile radius before resuming play.
- c. Any subsequent thunder or lightning after the beginning of the 30-minute count will reset the clock and another 30-minute count should begin.
- 5. In the event a person is struck by lightning call 911 immediately. If there are signs of cardiac or respiratory distress administer CPR.
- 6. Inform umpires/referees of your plan before a contest begins.
- 7. Inform student athletes and parents of the lightning policy at start of season.

[This plan derived and adapted from a variety of national guidelines.]

Proposal: At the Sports Committee meeting prior to the beginning of the season for each sport, the committee will determine the process for the regular season selection of All Conference players. The plan will be submitted to the Governing Board for approval before implementation.
Each All Conference team will be comprised of the numbers allowed in bylaws 7.3.b.i through 7.3.vi.
The process proposed by the committee is required to follow the long-established conference guidelines as found in the bylaws on p. 17-18 in a note: "These awards are not "popularity/congeniality contests. Coaches are NOT obligated to select an S-A from each team. These awards recognize consistent excellence and skill in a particular sport throughout that particular season. Individual statistics and team record is not always indicative of who is deserving. However, statistics and record are good criteria. Rule of thumb-these awards are for the most excellent players in each sport."
This process may include, but is not limited to, procedures that were utilized previously.
At the end of each season, the new process will be evaluated by the coaches and the GB for how well it worked. It will either be refined or recommended as is for use in 2024-2025.
The process will not substantially change every year unless the GB makes the changes.
Background in support of change: Coaches have never fully supported any process used to select All Conference so the GB decided to have them come up with a plan. Each particular sport may have unique needs to consider so having the committee devise it would allow for different plans that meet specifics of each sport.
Discussion: How will this change affect the conference? Long-term? Short-term? The hope is that it will change All Conference selection for the better in the long run.

The undersigned hereby releases and forever discharges the Alabama Christian Sports Conference (ACSC), along with all of its agents, volunteers, directors, officers, assigns, and attorneys, from any and all claims, demands, actions, causes of action or suits arising out of any injuries, known or unknown, which have resulted or may in the future result from any ACSC sponsored athletic game, activity, contest, or event.

The undersigned hereby assumes all risk of injury associated with any such ACSC athletic game, activity, contest, or event and fully indemnifies and holds harmless the ACSC along with it agents, volunteers, directors, officers, assigns, and attorneys from and against each and every liability, loss, cost, damage, and expense, including attorney's fees, which the ACSC along with its agents, employees, directors, officers, assigns, and attorneys may incur as a result of any ACSC sponsored athletic game, activity, contest, or event. The ACSC does not have employees. All persons associated with the ACSC are volunteers.

ALABAMA CHRISTIAN SPORTS CONFERENCE Concussion Information and Concussion Policy Signature Page (Required for participation in any ACSC sport)

A concussion is a brain injury and all brain injuries are serious. They are caused by a bump, blow, or jolt to the head, or by a blow to another part of the body with the force transmitted to the head. They can range from mild to severe and can disrupt the way the brain normally works. Even though most concussions are mild, all concussions are potentially serious and may result in complications including prolonged brain damage and death if not recognized and managed properly. In other words, even a "ding" or a bump on the head can be serious. You cannot see a concussion and most sports concussions occur without loss of consciousness. Signs and symptoms of concussion may show up right after the injury or can take hours or days to fully appear. If your child reports any symptoms of concussion or if you notice the symptoms or signs of concussion yourself, seek medical attention right away.

Symptoms may include one or more of the following:

- Headaches
- "Pressure in head"
- Nausea or vomiting
- Neck Pain
- Balance problems or dizziness
- Blurred, double, or fuzzy vision
- Sensitivity to light or noise
- · Feeling sluggish or slowed down
- Feeling foggy or groggy
- Drowsiness
- Change in sleep patterns
- Amnesia
- "Don't feel right"; fatigue or low energy
- Sadness; nervousness or anxiety; irritability
- More emotional; confusion
- Concentration or memory problems (forgetting game plays)
- Repeating the same question/comment

Signs observed by teammates, parents, and coaches include:

- Appears dazed
- Vacant facial expression
- Confused about assignment
- Forgets plays
- Is unsure of game, score, or opponent
- Moves clumsily or displays lack of coordination
- Answers questions slowly
- Slurred speech
- Shows behavior or personality changes
- Can't recall events prior to hit
- Can't recall events after hit
- Seizures or convulsions
- Any change in typical behavior or personality
- Loses consciousness

ACSC Concussion Policy:

Any student athlete who exhibits signs, symptoms, or behaviors consistent with a concussion shall be removed from the contest and shall not return to play until a medical release is issued by a medical doctor.

Any health care professional or coach may identify concussive signs, symptoms, or behaviors of a student athlete during any type of athletic activity. Once concussive signs are identified, only a medical doctor can clear an athlete to return to play.

What can happen if my child keeps on playing with a concussion or returns too soon?

Athletes with the signs and symptoms of concussion should be removed from play immediately. Continuing to play with the signs and symptoms of a concussion leaves the athlete especially vulnerable to greater injury. There is an increased risk of significant damage from a concussion for a period of time after that concussion occurs, particularly if the athlete suffers another concussion before completely recovering from the first one. This can lead to prolonged recovery, or even to severe brain swelling (second impact syndrome) with devastating and even fatal consequences. It is well known that adolescent or teenage athletes will often fail to report symptoms of injuries. Concussions are no different. As a result, education of administrators, coaches, parents and students is the key to a student-athlete's safety.

If you think your child has suffered a concussion:

Any athlete even suspected of suffering a concussion should be removed from the game or practice immediately. No athlete may return to activity after an apparent head injury or concussion, regardless of how mild it seems or how quickly symptoms clear, without clearance from a medical doctor. Close observation of the athlete should continue for several hours. You should also inform your child's coach if you think that your child may have a concussion. Remember it's better to miss one game than miss the whole season. And when in doubt, the athlete sits out.

Doug Harrison Christian Character Team

Each season for every sanctioned sport, the ACSC recognizes one player from each Varsity team as a member of the Doug Harrison Christian Character Team. Christian Character Team members are high school athletes who by their testimony and their actions have consistently exemplified the highest ideals of Christian character and leadership.

Each player is selected by his/her coach using the following criteria statements as a guideline:

- He/she accepts their God-given gift of athletic ability and works to maximize that potential by giving 100% at practice and in competition.
- He/she consistently demonstrates a Christian example in moral maturity and a spirit of good sportsmanship.
- He/she provides Christian leadership both in and out of the athletic arena in their home, church, and community.
- He/she has earned the respect of his teammates and members of the opposing teams through his/her dependability, work ethic, and willingness to make personal sacrifices for the good of the team.
- He/she attends church regularly and becomes involved in ministry opportunities.

Coaches submit the names at a prescribed date on the ACSC Calendar. The team will be announced as the culmination of the regular season award ceremony during the State Tournament or Championship with each team member receiving a framed certificate.
