

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew , the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him."

How much? Too many! I recently needed to buy one of those small flat Lithium batteries for a bathroom scale, and the smallest pack was of six. But I just needed one! So, I have five #2032 batteries if anyone needs one! Or have you ever made the mistake of ordering five of some item, but it wasn't five singles that you got, but five gross. Maybe like hearing about the new office manager that ends up with half a million paper clips because of such an order error! A casual bible reader may think we are dealing with such an extreme example today when we hear that Jesus transformed five huge jars of water into wine, each jar holding between 20-30 gallons! That is a lot of wine adding up to maybe 120-180 gallons! How long a wedding reception was Jesus planning on for the newlyweds?

The point is that such miracles of abundance reveal who we are dealing with: Jesus Christ. This is the same Jesus who (in John 6:1-14) can take five loaves and two fish and multiply them to feed over 5,000 people. This is the same Jesus who (in Luke 19:47 & 21:37) could teach all day-every day at the Temple. And this is the same Jesus who even after sunset worked to heal every sick person and cast out every demon brought to him, perhaps including the 'whole town at his door' as Mark 1:32-33 says it. But our sacrificially giving Savior Jesus is just like that. He gives us His everything. Jesus tells us in John 10:10 that He came to give us life, and life abundantly! And the gospel writer John (Jn 13:1) tells that Jesus 'loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end' {we can translate 'end' as loving us to 'the fullest-the max'!}. What do people say, "Go big or go home?" That is Jesus! But while Jesus is so good at producing lavishly for us, that we also know He has a heart always focused on the 'small' too! Especially if it is all that we have! He who made a special point of celebrating a 'little widow woman's tiny gift offering of a meager two coins in the collection basket (Luke 21:1-4). Or Jesus who taught that the 'least can be greatest' in Luke 9:48 and that even faith the size of a mustard seed can 'move mountains' (Matthew 17:20). So while Jesus can do mighty awesome works, He also knows that if our most and best happens to be small, if it is for God's glory, He will add to what our gifts lack! Again, how can we not be overwhelmed with gratitude for such a loving Lord?

Yet, thank God too, that we know Him! Another splendid lesson from this gospel is how those who are closest to Jesus access inner strength from knowing Him, aware of how thoroughly He will take care of us. I like to point out how in this miracle, that the only people who know the source of this miraculous abundance is Jesus, Mary, some apostles and the faithful servants who do what they are told. John 2:9 says the "headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from (although the servers who had drawn the water knew)". Why do just a few know the source? Another question may be, Why do just a few try to know, and work at learning this abundant source? I believe this 'FIRST' miracle-sign of Jesus is meant to be an early 'peak experience' for them. Jesus meant it to build their trust in Him as His closest followers. They alone here, are let in on Jesus being the driver of this miracle! Perhaps this is similar to the 'Transfiguration' miracle in Matthew 17:1-2, which says that Jesus led only "Peter, James, and John his brother, up a high mountain by themselves. And He was transfigured before them." Jesus is strengthening the trust of His closest followers (His future church leaders) through this early glimpse of his divinity. He lets them in more deeply than others at this time, so they will always keep in mind who they are working with. Jesus will provide! A friend knows things! Jesus was letting them in fully on His identity and mission. Later in John15:15, Jesus will tell everyone gathered at the Last Supper, "I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I call you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father." This personal intimacy and close knowledge of Jesus will be the apostles' inner reserve of courage for the needed push to manage through difficult persecutions (like keeping a mountain view of things even while we are in the valley!) Yet, again, Jesus will provide and provide for His followers abundantly!
