





2014 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

EDUCATION AND DISABILITIES

-Updated and improved internal referral process from LULAC to Birth to Three, Local Education Agency and Mental Health.

-100% of data entry for checkpoint #1 completed before November 28th (Increased by 25%).

-100% of Head Start Teachers have a Bachelor's Degree (increase of 17%).

-LULAC was able to offer Early Language and Literacy Course on site, 100% of staff passed course.

-Several promotions for teachers and coaches within the program.

FAMILY COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP

-The Family Advocates pushed for parent involvement and completed Child and Family Reviews to assist with the development process.

-Completion of 91% of Head Start goals.

-100% of Early Head Start families established family partnership agreements.

-FCP staff held several workshops and seminars to help develop the community and families alike.

One of the biggest accomplishments of 2014 was the Dual Language Project. Both parents and staff were excited for the project because the

need for multiple languages is at large. The support and participation has been phenomenal.

GENERAL

-Head Start 50th Anniversary.

-LULAC was commended on achieving full compliance on all the guidelines associated with the program.

-The Dual Language and Literacy Project continues to be a major success having had 100% participation from parents and staff.

HEALTH AND NUTRITION

-Early Childhood Hearing Outreach (ECHO) Initiative - LULAC participated in Train the Trainer sessions in Utah on Otoacoustic Emissions (OAE) hearing screening practices for children 0-3 years of age.


-LULAC conducted a training to other EHS programs in the community on OAE screening practices, OAE protocol, tracking tools, screening forms and follow up.

-l am Moving I am Learning program -LULAC continues to participate in the IMIL program, which is a proactive approach for addressing childhood obesity in Head Start children. IMIL seeks to increase daily moderate to vigorous physical activity (MVPA) improving the quality of movement activities intentionally planned and facilitated by adults, and promote healthy food choices every day.

The service LULAC provides is considered a team effort between Management, Family Advocates, Teachers and administrative staff; all in collaboration to provide the upmost quality in New Haven for children ages 0-5 has ever experienced.
