Following this November's election, there will be two new Directors on the District's Board of Directors. The Board of Directors are your elected representatives who determine the direction and policies of the District.



There are five community members who are vying for your vote for the two available positions: Seth Burt, Craig Carpenter, William Hewlitt, William King, and Paul Miller. The top two receiving the most votes will be your new Board members. Get to know these candidates and their positions regarding the issues important to you. Voting can be done by mail-in ballot or in person. The early voting period is from October 10, 2020 to November 8, 2022 with Election Day November 8, 2022. You have a say in the future direction of this District. Be involved in your community, participate and vote.

Board Meeting Highlights

Regular Board Meetings are the Third Thursday at 6:30 PM

July – Supervisor Weber reported on the maintenance and repairs in the District as well as the progress on the Encina Dr. pipeline project. Interim Chief Lindley reported on the Fire Department calls and the great news that the Department is now providing 24/7 coverage at the station. General Manager Huff reported on potential grant opportunities from the recently passed National Infrastructure Bill. The auditors from Halliday & Co. presented their annual audit for FY 2020-2021 and the Board voted to accept the audit. The Board accepted the resignation

of Vice-President Rickey Weber and approved a resolution of appreciation for his service and approved posting notice and intent to appoint a replacement director. There was a discussion regarding the status of a potential rate increase and the Board directed General Manager Huff to hold a Community Forum to address community concerns regarding rates. **August** – Supervisor Weber reported on the maintenance and repairs in the District as well



as a recent number of main and service line repairs that had taken them away from the Encina Dr. pipeline project. Interim Chief Lindley reported on the Fire Department calls and reminded everyone to come to the Annual Firefighters Association Picnic on Aug. 20th. General Manager Huff reported on a credit from Running Springs for wastewater treatment costs and APCWD's participation with CalWARN. Interim Chief Lindley made a presentation to the Board regarding a potential FEMA grant to cover a full-time position salary and benefits and the Board approved going forward with the grant application. The Board reviewed Statements of Interest from and interviewed community members seeking appointment to the Board vacancy. The Board then appointed Paul Miller to fill the vacancy until the end of the term in December 2022. General Manager Huff reported the results of the Community Forum on Rates and after a discussion regarding potential rates the Board decided to move forward with a modified proposed rate increase and authorized General Manager Huff to send out the Prop. 218 Notices and set the Public Hearing for October 20th. The Board also performed the annual General Manager review and voted unanimously to extend General Manager Huff's employment contract for an additional year.

September – Supervisor Weber reported on the maintenance and repairs in the District as well as the continuing progress on the Encina Dr. pipeline project. Interim Chief Lindley reported on calls and responses for the month and provided a report on the success of the picnic. In his administrative report, General Manager Huff reported that audit preparations were going well and that well levels were improving due to the recent rains. The Board approved a 4.5% increase in the District's employee health benefit contribution for calendar year 2023.
