his resurrection and his ascension. As we read Jesus' interactions with his disciples we hear his love, his patience, and his challenge to the disciples as he prepares them to persist in understanding and carrying the message to the world.

This is our opportunity to remember and persevere in our own awareness

of just how much God loves us, so much that he gave his Son to die for us. It is also the time for us to hear Jesus' voice as he prepares the disciples, as we are God's children and disciples of Jesus Christ.

Jesus asks us to remember how much we are loved, to keep his commandments, and to love one another because Jesus has chosen YOU. Everything that Jesus did and said was to fulfill the scriptures. Even though Jesus will be physically gone from the earth, he sent the Holy Spirit to guide us and to be with us. On the Day of Pentecost, we will remember how the Advocate came to the disciples and is with us.

In remembrance of the Advocate, the Holy Spirit who came to be with the disciples and with us, we encourage everyone to wear **RED** on May 20. On that day we will also recognize our high school seniors who are graduating. As we send them off to the next phase of their lives, we can do so trusting that our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, and our Advocate, the Holy Spirit will be with the graduates, guiding them throughout their lives.

In May, we will be baptizing Declan Bucholz, son of Amy and Tucker, following Jesus' command that we "go out making disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28: 19-20. Jesus has called us to feed the hungry. We have an opportunity to feed the hungry in our own neighborhood this summer. In collaboration with Great Plains Food Bank, we will be distributing lunch to children at the playground on 7th Avenue, across from South Elementary School. We will need volunteers to make this happen, so please pray and listen to God calling you. Tell others of

listen to God calling you. Tell others of the ministry of Jesus that we will be participating in this summer. Do you have a neighbor, friend, or family member that would like to volunteer with you? More details will be coming... be ready to accept Jesus' call.

I ask that you also keep me in your prayers as I begin my studies in the Doctor of Ministry pro-

gram, otherwise known as "DMin" at the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary. I will be at UDTS in Dubuque, Iowa from May 22-May 31. Dixon Moorhead will be in the pulpit on May 27.

Each day, I give thanks for the generosity of God, for each of you, and the call God has extended to all of us as individuals and as Community Presbyterian Church.




