Dear Friends,

When Jesus gave to His disciples the commandment that they were to "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and teaching them to observe all that He had commanded them" (Matthew 28:19), He was giving them a commandment which would continue without interruption in the Church until He returns. What I mean to say is that if they are to teach those whom they baptize to obey all that Jesus has commanded them, this includes the commandment to make disciples by baptizing and teaching. This means disciples making disciples without any conclusion to the process. However, the Church in America and Europe is seeing a decline in many congregations because we have not been attending to Jesus' commandment to make disciples. A significant part of the problem is that we often lack a process for making disciples. While most congregations know the New Testament's definition of what discipleship is, we tend to be less clear about how to make disciples. The "what" of discipleship is pretty simple to identify – "love God" (Matthew 22:37), "love one another" (John 13:34-35), and "love everyone else" (Matthew 22:39). Unfortunately, our approach to encouraging our members to walk as disciples and make disciples has frequently been to announce the "what" of discipleship and say "go and do it." It has not been happening as frequently or as well as we had hoped because the Church has dropped the ball on explaining the "how" of discipleship. Simply knowing the "what" will not produce disciples who are making disciples until we get clear about the "how" of discipleship. Here at St. John's, we explain the "how" with the following three words "grow, share, and bless." Loving God means worshiping Him, studying His Word, and going deeper in our prayer life – "growing." Loving one another involves fellowship, caring for each other and the gifts God has given our congregation to steward, and offering our gifts (time, talent, treasure) to God's work among us - "sharing." Loving everyone else does not simply entail announcing to the community that we love them. Loving our neighbor compels us to share the saving Gospel with them, extend mercy

to those in need, and contribute to the welfare of our city in meaningful ways – "blessing." Of course, loving everyone else is not limited to the evangelism and mercy that we extend to Beloit.

Moving inquirers from "nonbelievers" to "believers" and "new believers" to "mature believers" involves encouraging them to give more and more attention to their participation in all three areas – growing, sharing, and blessing. There is a logical sequence among these three areas in which development in growth will inspire development in the other two areas. It is the responsibility of our church leaders (myself and our boards) to provide meaningful opportunities in each of these three areas for our members to participate. The good news is that the process of evaluating new programs on the basis of whether or not they advance our growth in these areas will protect us from giving our time and efforts to activities which do not assist us in making disciples. Additionally, as our members continue to grow in spiritual maturity, we will see them bringing others in to join them in the journey. Please be in prayer for our congregation, as we clarify and develop our discipling process.

If Today Was Your Last Day (From the "Man Stuff Blog" of Lutheran Hour Ministries)

One recent morning Alex Bestler, 23, decided to walk a trail near Mesa, Arizona, with a friend. They stuck to the trail but suddenly found themselves under attack. While the friend ran for help, thousands of bees swarmed around Bestler. When park employees arrived, they tried to rescue him to no avail; they couldn't get close before they too were driven off by the insects.

Finally, Maricopa County Sheriff Sergeant Allen Romer arrived at the park, jumped on a park utility task vehicle and raced to Bestler's location. Two rural metro fire fighters helped him load Bestler onto the UTV and remove him from the scene, still covered with bees, while the swarm pursued. They distanced themselves from the swarm and arrived at a waiting emergency vehicle where life-saving measures were begun. Unfortunately, Bestler died after arriving at Desert Vista Hospital. Medical staff and sheriff's detectives estimate he had over 1,000 stings.

Experts say the so-called "killer bees" have migrated from Brazil into the American Southwest. They are actually Africanized bees. They look like normal bees and are no more poisonous, but they're much more aggressive and more likely to attack in swarms which relentlessly pursue their target.

What gets me about these bee attacks is how they strike without warning. Construction workers and people mowing lawns have been attacked and killed by swarming bees as well.

Every morning when I wake up I take for granted my life will go like normal -- as will the lives of the people around me. But these stories remind me that my life -- or theirs -- can be altered or ended without warning, at any moment.

Every time we hear of a person killed in a car accident, a heart attack, or a violent crime, we need to stop and see ourselves, our loved ones, and the people around us at work and in our community. We need to live with more purpose, more understanding, and a greater sense of urgency in sharing our faith. They may not always be tomorrow. Today may be their last day -- or ours.

Thankfully, all of us who have been given faith in Jesus will be ready when our last hour arrives. But what about those who don't trust in Jesus? For their sake we need to remember the urgency of our Lord's call and get busy!

Whether it's killer bees, malicious viruses, or some other scourge, they're just subtle reminders that there are no lifetime guarantees when it comes to the number of our tomorrows.
