


BIRTH ANNOUNCEMENTS:



The people of the Middle East have a long and interesting history, filled with problems, dating all the way back to the time of Abram. The first we read of them is in Genesis 11:31, "And Terah took Abram his son, and Loe the son of Haran his son's son, and Sarai his daughter in law, his son Abram's wife; and they went forth with them from Ur of the Chaldees, to go into the land of Canaan; and they came unto Haran, and dwelf there."

Ur of the Chaldees was a well established city near the mouth of the Euphrates River. Excavations of the city show something of the splendor. There were town drains, streets, two-storied houses and a great temple tower. They had a writing in common use and various other evidences of a highly developed civilization. Although the Chaldees were addicted to astrology they were also idolators. This was Abrams homeland from which God called "His Friend" (Isaiah 41:8) that he might be led to a land where he would become the father of a nation of whom God said, "I will be to them a God, and they shall be to me a people", Heb. 8:10.

They sojourned for a while in the land of Haran, in the upper Mesopotamia, a part of what was then Syria (Genesis 11:27-32). Later after Terah died, the Lord spoke again, telling Abram to leave his kindred and journey on to Canaan, Genesis 12:1-5. Abram built an altar first on the plain of Moreh — just south of the Sea of Galilee — where the Lord told Abram this land would be his and to his seed. He then moved on to Bethel, just north of Jerusalem, and because of a famine in the land, journeyed on to Egypt, Genesis 12:6-10. No doubt it was at this time Abram acquired an Egyptian maid for Sarai, by the name of Hagar.

In Genesis 13:1-4 we read "And Abram went up out of Egypt, he and his wife, and all that he had - and Abram was very rich in cattle, in silver and in gold. And he went on his journeys from the south even to Bethel, even to the place where his tent had been at the beginning; - unto the place of the altar, which he had made there at the first; and there Abram called on the name of the Lord." Lot also had herds of cattle and verse 7 tells us "there was strife between the herdmen of Abram's cattle and the herdmen of Lot's cattle". Abram, wishing to stop the strife, gave Lot his choice that they might separate. Lot chose the fertile plain of the Jordan and journeyed eastward to that valley. He dwelled in the cities of the plain and eventually moved to Sodom, where the people were "wicked sinners before the Lord exceedingly".

Why all the trouble there?

"And the Lord said unto Abram, after that Lot was separated from him Lift up now thine eyes, and look from the place where thou art northward, and southward, and eastward and westward; for all the land which thou seest, to thee will I give it, and to thy seed forever. And I will make thy seed as the dust of the earth; so that if a man can number the dust of the earth, then shall thy seed also be numbered," Genesis 13:14-16. Then at God's bidding, Abram moved again to the part of the land called Hebron, southwest of Jerusalem. (Many years later his sons buried both Abram and Sarai here).

Abram was getting up in years and yet had no heir. It was a custom in the land from which Abram came, that if a man had no son he adopted one that he might have an heir. In Genesis 15:2, 3 we read "And Abram said, Lord God, what wilt thou give me seeing I go childless, and the steward of my house is this Eliezer of Damascus? And Abraham said, "Behold, to me thou hast given no seed: and, lo, one born in mine house is my heir". It is believed by some that Abram adopted Eliezer that he might be as one born in his house. However, it was also the custom with those adoptions that if a man later had a son of his own, the son became the heir instead of the adopted one. But now let us read on, (verses 4-6) "And behold, the word of the Lord came

unto him, saying, This shall not be thine heir; but he that shall come forth out of thine own bowels shall be thine heir. And He brought him forth abroad, and said, look now toward heaven, and tell the stars, if thou be able to number them: and he said unto him, So shall thy seed be. And he believed in the Lord; and he counted it to him for righteousness." Again in verse 18 God gives the boundary to be from the River of Egypt — a river flowing through the middle of the Sinai peninsula — to the Euphrates River.

In chapter 16 we find Abram and Sarai trying to reason with themselves a way to fulfil the promise of God, (verse 3) "And Sarai, Abrams wife took Hagar, her maid the Egyptian, — and gave her to her husband Abram to be his wife." Trouble began between Sarai and Hagar and Hagar fled from Sarai. "And the angel of the Lord found her — and the angel of the Lord said unto her, Return to thy mistress, and submit thyself under her hands. And the angel of the Lord said unto her, I will multiply thy seed exceedingly, that it shall not be numbered, for multitude. — And he will be a wild man; his hand will be against every man, and every man's hand against him; and he shall dwell in the presence of all his brethren." "And Hagar bare Abram a son and Abram called his son's name — Ishmæl".

The next communion recorded between Abram and God changes Abrams name to Abraham and Sarai's name to Sarah then God tells Abraham that Sarah shall bear a son, (chapter 17; verse 19) "and thou shalt call his name Isaac; and I will establish my covenant with him for an everlasting covenant, and with his seed after him". The following year Sarah gave Abraham a son and they called his name Isaac, Genesis 21:1-5. Here again, Abraham's inheritance will pass from the son of the bondwoman to the son of the free woman which becomes the source of an animosity which has continued until our day.

Meanwhile, the wickedness of Sodom has come up before God and we read in chapters 18 and 19 of how Abraham interceded that the righteous, if any, might be spared. For the sake of Abraham, God sent two angels to Sodom and they led Lot, his wife and two of his daughters out of the city telling them to flee for their lives. Lot's wife looked back and became a pillar of salt but Lot and the two daughters fled to Zoar and later to the mountains. It is here that they became guilty of incest. One daughter bare a son and called him Moab. He became the father of the Moabites, a nation which settled east of the dead sea. Lot's other daughter bore a son and called him Ben-Ammi. He became the father of the Ammonites and they settled an area north of the Moabites and east of the Jordan River. It might be stated here that this area of the Moabites and the Ammonites was the same which Lot chose when he and Abraham separated some time before. The Moabites and the Ammonites were traditional enemies of the Israelites - a conflict which started, in part, between the herdsmen of Lot and Abraham.

It might be interesting here to note that the city of Amman, the town where the hi-jacked people were recently held hostage in the Jordanian desert, is marked on the maps as the capitol of the kingdom of Ammon. We also have here another group of people mentioned who seem to have no particular country as they were against the Jordanians as well as the Israelites, that is the Palestinian guerrillas. I do not attempt to place them but since the word "Palestine" comes from the Greek word translated "Philistia" or "Philistine" and in Psalm 83 they are listed as an enemy of Israel, could there be a connection here with the Philistines of the Bible?

Now let us return to Isaac for a few comments. Abraham sent Eliezer to the house of Nahor, Abraham's brother, to seek a wife for Isaac, Genesis 24. Thus Rebekah, the daughter of Bethuel and the granddaughter of Nahor, a Syrian, became the wife of Isaac. Reading on in Chapter 25 — they had twin sons, Esau and Jacob, who were very different in personality. After the boys were grown, Esau sold his birthright to Jacob, making him the one to receive his father's blessing and God's covenant to have a people to be called by his name. Later, Esau regretted this (Heb. 12:17) "when he would have inherited the blessing, he was rejected: for he found no place for repentance, though he sought it carefully with tears". Another cause for conflict has started which still continues.

Ishmael married an Egyptian (Gen. 21:21) and had 12 sons (Genesis 25:13-16) and in 28:9 we learn he had

a daughter who became one of Esau's wives. Esau was the father of the Edomites, who settled to the south of the dead sea, another avowed enemy of the Israelites. There is an interesting passage in Numbers 20:14-21. When Israel was making her way to the promised land and requested permission to pass through Edom, they were refused and Israel found it necessary to go around the land of Edom.

Another note here which might be of interest is that in Jesus' day the country of the Edomites went by the name of Idumaea, which was the Greek name for Edom. Herod the Great was of this nationality. No wonder he had the children of Bethlehem slain when he heard that Jesus was "born King of the Jews" in that little town, Matt. 2:2, 16. Esau was for the time being reigning over Jocob and he did not want a king for them of their own blood!

Jacob was sent, by his parents, when Esau vowed he would kill Jacob after Jocob got the blessing of their father, Isaac, instead of Esau, to Laban, His mother's brother — a Syrian. There Jacob married Leah and Rachel, Laban's daughters. Jacob had 12 sons and a daughter, the same as Ishmael, and both men became the fathers of great nations.

Joshua received the instructions which more or less set the boundary lines of Israel; Joshua 1:2-4, "Moses my servant is dead; now therefore arise, go over this Jordan, thou, and all this people, unto the land which I do give to them, even to the children of Israel. Every place that the sole of your foot shall tread upon, that have I given unto you, as I said unto Moses. From the wilderness of this Lebanon even unto the great river, the river Euphrates, all the land of the Hittites, and unto the great sea toward the going down of the sun, shall be your coast."

In the song of Asaph (Psalm 83), he prays for God to intervene against the Enemies of Israel and quotes the enemies of saying, "Come, and let us cut them off from being a nation; that the name of Israel may be no more in remembrance". In 1967 Nassar, of Egypt, declared publicly, "Israel shall cease to be a nation", but in 1970 the headlines in the newspapers read "Nassar dies of heart attack".

Though all these nations, Syria, Arabs, Egyptians, Edomites, Moabites, and Ammonites, can trace relationship to Abraham and still carry on a jealous conflict to possess the land; Israel carries the promise made to Abraham, "In Isaac shall thy seed be called". They may all band together and they may continue to fight against Israel but God has written the will and it shall stand as written.




A Pastor is a good shepherd whose job it is to remind his flock of the beauty and value of God's eternal promise.

We are glad that the Lord has seen fit to impress upon the hearts of Brother and Sister Ted Barker to remain as Superintendent of the school for another year. We feel they have given much of themselves to see the school grow in number and spirituality. Our movement in turn has been blessed by those who have attended school. We appreciate all efforts Bro. Ted and his party are putting forth in making a tour of churches in behalf of Bible School. Also we appreciate the warm reception you have given this group. Thanks for being our co-workers for the Glory of God.

As always, many repairs are needful in maintenance of our buildings in Baxter Springs. New shower stalls are being installed in the boys dormitory. The hard freeze broke water pipes in the girls dormitory. Repairs in the old home are an annual must, as so many of us know. We are glad to report that some of these jobs have already been started by a group of men during work week February 28th through March 3rd. May God richly bless the ones who worked so faithfully. May God bless you who send in the finances to help on these projects.

As the Lord blesses our school and it continues to grow each year, our needs also expand to the point that we must re-evaluate our school-plant and equipment, and earnestly pray that our zeal and vision is kept in accord with the blessings God has given us. We feel that each church visited by the Bible School Choir was blessed; and think of the blessing and encouragement you have been to these young people as they came to your church and community. "Facts About the Bible"

The Bible contains 66 books, 1,189 chapters, 31,163 verses, 733,746 words, 3,566,480 letters. The shortest chapter is Psalm 117; the longest is Psalm 119. The shortest verse is John 11:35; and the longest is Esther 8:9; the middle verse is Psalm 118:8. "And" occurs 46,-227 times, and "Jehovah" 6,855 times. Ezra 7:21 contains all the letters of the alphabet except "j." Isaiah 37 and II Kings 19 are alike.

Christ's return is spoken of on the average of once in every 25 verses in the New Testament. The word "God" does not occur in Esther. The Bible is read in more than 1,200 languages and dialects. The Geneva Bible (1560) was the first whole Bible divided into verses, and the first to use italics. The Authorized Version was set forth in 1611. The Bible is the source of wisdom, knowledge, love, peace, joy, faith, hope and holiness.
