TIME OF GRACE BLOG

Political bitterness

Do you ever read the "Comments" section underneath online magazine articles? You need a strong stomach. When they can hide behind a fake screen name, people come out with the most disappointingly abusive and vulgar statements. Even YouTube music videos seem to bring out the beast in people as they shout and curse at one another. We live in an age of h8ters.

I have also been pretty glum for many months, years actually, about the level of bitterness and incivility in America's political talk. Gun rights, abortion, immigration, health care, politicized redistricting, and level of taxation all seem to inflame people to windy self-congratulation and demonization of those who disagree with them. It doesn't help that in the last 16 years not one but two candidates won the presidency in spite of losing the popular vote. It's just as what Vince Lombardi said after losing a championship in the '60s—"We didn't lose; we just ran out of time." Political conflict never ceases.

I am comforted a little by my summer reading. I am working through Kenneth Stampp's *America in 1857*, an in-depth look at a pivotal year in America's politics that set the stage for the Civil War. The level of angry and contemptuous rhetoric was even worse in those years. Newspapers never even pretended neutrality or non-biased reporting. They were all heavily identified with one party or the other. Perhaps you know the story of how in 1856 pro-slavery Rep. Preston Brooks badly beat Sen. Charles Sumner with a cane, and did it in the U.S. Senate! Perhaps I've been dreaming that American political discourse ever was civil and constructive.

It is important for Christians that we not let Satan steal our joy at the tremendous blessings we receive by living here. Freedom of religion and speech were bought for us at a bloody price. Here is what I pledge myself to this week, and I invite you to take the pledge with me:

- Stay grateful. Tell God, and illustrate your prayer with your life, how much you appreciate your country.
- Stay civil. Decide that you will never post abusive or hateful online comments. Decide that you will listen twice before speaking once on all political issues.
- Stay prayerful. Ask God this week to show mercy to us, to keep our leaders from political follies, to use our world position wisely and unselfishly, and to accomplish the mission he set for us by giving us so much wealth and power. Ask that he will bless our efforts to reduce military conflicts and bring about peace.



Why another Bible? In 2011 the publishing house Zondervan stopped printing the 1984 NIV Bible that was used by most members of the Lutheran church bodies. Since then, replacement translations were found to be inaccurate.

An association of Lutheran professors, pastors, teachers and lay people, called The Wartburg Project, have worked together to produce a new translation that is true to our beliefs as well as God's original word, called the Evangelical Heritage Version.

Like the original books of the Bible, it is addressed to the preaching and teaching, worship life and devotional use of the Church. Although some of the language has been updated, great care was taken to keep the content true to the original.

After a lead translator produces a draft translation, each book is then reviewed by several technical reviewers on the basis of the Greek or Hebrew text. A second draft is produced which then goes through a popular review by pastors, teachers and lay people for clarity and readability.



After this input is collated the final draft is prepared for publication. More information may be found at their website: wartburgproject.org

Currently the New Testament and Psalms is available in one book with the Old Testament expected to be out in 2018. God willing a study Bible will follow and perhaps specialized products.

This Bible is not the official product of any church body or publishing house.

LUTHER'S SMALL CATECHISM is a treasure that has graced the church ever since it was first published in 1529. Throughout the centuries it has been a textbook used by hundreds of thousands of students of all ages to learn the truths of Scripture.

This book contains a clear and orderly presentation of Bible doctrine with Bible verses following the questions to let Scripture speak for itself and encourage students to search the Scriptures to discover God's answers. Often additional explanations are included to summarize Biblical truths.

Two noteworthy features:

- The role of law and gospel in the new-self versus old-self struggle is highlighted in the transitional units.
- Each of the 51 units ends with a connections section that could be the basis of individual or family devotions.

Luther use the catechism throughout his life and urged others to follow his example.



ST. JOHNS YOUTH GROUP

This summer the Youth Group had the amazing opportunity to partake in two mission trips. Their first mission trip was from June 11-16 to Messiah Lutheran Church in Wichita, Kansas where they helped run a half day soccer camp based vacation Bible school. Two vans carrying eleven people ventured twelve hours each way to help out the folks in Wichita. Three very inviting host families welcomed the youth group into their homes giving them a comfy place to rest their heads after some long hot days. The teens helped with crafts and soccer skills with approximately 40 children, ages 3 - 12, while enjoying some 100° days. The theme for Messiah's VBS was 'Victory'. The Youth Group loved sharing with these children that our 'Victory' comes through Jesus, and because of that we will all receive the eternal prize of heaven. The group also did several service projects for Messiah. They cleaned out and organized the storage room for the Early Childhood Center. A dirt ramp was built for a wheelchair bound child so he could get on and off the playground safely. A play structure was reassembled and placed back on the playground. The grill for their Father's Day Cookout was given an aggressive scrubbing, and the group also helped purge files that needed to be shredded for the Early Childhood Center. After VBS was completed and cleaned up for the day and reset for the next day, the Youth Group did manage to find some fun activities to occupy their down time. The teens enjoyed adventures including go-carting, mini golf, laser tag, a water park, seeing a movie, and eating local favorite foods.

The second mission trip took the Youth Group to Bethel Lutheran Church in Sioux Falls, South Dakota from July 9-14. This time twelve people were able to join the trip. This trip was only seven hours each way, making it feel rather short for the drivers! Bethel runs a full day VBS from 9am-3pm.
