





The Spirit of Jesus Christ



MAKING A GOOD CONFESSION

"My religious education director has asked me to make a good confession in preparation for my reception into the Church on Easter Vigil. Please father, what constitutes a good confession?"



One of the exercises we are all encouraged to carry out during this Lenten season is the sacrament of reconciliation, that is, confession. However, going for confession because one is told to do so and nothing more is as good as not going for one at all. Even though we are encouraged to go to confession as often as we can especially during this season of lent, we are to make the experience our own, experiencing it with our whole being, with a contrite heart and humble spirit. This takes us

back to the question of what constitutes a good confession.

Making a good confession begins with a sincere examination of our conscience. During this exercise, one makes efforts to recall what sin or sins one has committed, and, if possible, how many times the sins were committed since one's last confession. Moving on from there, one is expected to be truly and sincerely sorry for those sins, freely reject them, and prayerfully resolve not to carry them out again and to avoid the occasions that make one give in to their commission.

It should be noted that the entire exercise is a prayerful experience. As one approaches a priest for confession, one should endeavor not to lose this sense of prayer. One should pray to God for the grace to remember one's sins and to continue to be truly sorry for them especially while in the confessional. When one gets into the confessional, one should mention clearly and precisely what sin or sins one has committed without beating round the bush or looking for explanations or excuses. One should note that full pardon awaits one in confession. When one finish mention - ing one's sin, one must listen carefully and prayerfully to the counsel of the priest, the penance the priest gives thereafter, and the prayer of absolution. Prior to the prayer of absolution, the priest invites the penitent to say the act of contrition. One must remember to carry out one's penance at a suitable time and place. However, given the possibility of forgetfulness, one is advised to carry out one's penance immediately after one leaves the confessional.
