The Reverend's Ruminations - September 2023

As I sit down to reflect with you, the Minnesota State Fair has just kicked off, and we wish our local 4-H competitors good luck at the big show! For many of us, The Great Minnesota Get-Together signifies a rapid downslope to Labor Day, and with it, the passing of another summer. I'm sure I'm not alone in wondering where those "lazy days of summer" from our childhoods went!?! Despite a few spurts of steamy hot temperatures, and the on/off smoky haze of Canadian wildfires, I'd have to say that summer has been pretty nice in Fairmont. Just when it seemed we were going to be severely affected by drought-like conditions, some much-needed rain fell while Ellen and I were on vacation out West, and it may be just enough to help area farm fields and gardens remain productive into autumn. Although we often arrive at the end of August feeling that summer has been too short, I hope that you and your family have had the chance to enjoy some of the sights, sounds, tastes, and activities that make summer in Minnesota so special!

With the inevitable return to school creeping up on children and parents alike, changes to the summer routine are upon us at church too. Keep in mind that our worship schedule is no longer changing with the seasons (remaining at 10:00 am all year), but Sunday School will resume on September 10th as part of the worship experience for families with children ages 3 through sixth grade. After a bit of a hiatus last spring, we will also be looking to offer a video-based adult faith formation option. Stay tuned for a scheduling decision on this class, and in the meantime, let me know if you have preferences on its timing.

I have acknowledged it many times before, but I'm sure you can agree that the Bible seems a daunting read if you attempt it from cover to cover. As you start to build an autumn or back-to-school routine, I encourage you to divide up the challenge by examining a few small sections that follow our Sunday morning lectionary readings. September's epistle readings will be drawn from the 12th through 14th chapters of Paul's Letter to the Romans and the first chapter of his Letter to the Philippians, while the month's gospel readings will continue to be drawn from Matthew, in his 16th, 18th, and 20th chapters. During our September worship services, my sermons will examine one of the primary ancestors of our faith: Moses. His birth narrative and "delivery" to Pharaoh's daughter amid the Egyptian king's death decree to all male Israelite babies is familiar to most of us from our formative Sunday School years, but we will also examine Moses' journey of leadership among the Israelites as they escape bondage in Egypt and begin to make their way toward the Promised Land.

Speaking (in a roundabout way) of travel, Ellen and I would like to thank you for your flexibility while we enjoyed our first "empty nest" vacation to the Badlands, Black Hills, Devil's Tower, and Yellowstone National Park. The travel went smoothly, the weather was cooperative—if even downright cold one morning—and the scenery was absolutely spectacular! As with most vacations, it was not long enough to do justice to the destination(s), but the rest and relaxation were wonderfully welcome after a busy early summer for both of us. Thank you also to all who supported us at City Band concerts and Fairmont Area Community Theater productions. We hope that our involvement in the community continues show forth the variety and talents with which God has graced this wonderful congregation. See you in worship soon, where we can all glorify and praise God together!

The Council met in Heritage Hall at 5:45 PM. The meeting was called to order by Moderator Abigail Anderson. Pastor Cory led in prayer. Motion to approve the minutes from the July 19th meeting was M/S/C (Amanda/Kay).

Hy-Vee & Fareway Report as of 21 August 2023



During the last four weeks, \$13,988.56 (6.99%) worth of Hy-Vee slips were received. After 34 weeks, Hy-Vee is at \$129,256.33 (64.63%) toward the 16th goal which is now \$200,000. We have been getting to the \$150,000 goal in about 44 weeks and the new \$200,000 will take almost 60 weeks.

During the same time, \$7,973.84 (5.32%) worth of Fareway slips were received. After 16 weeks, Fareway is at \$26,335.90 (17.56%) toward our 5th \$150,000 goal.

This program started the first of March 2011, so any slips from then until now can be used. Any Fairmont Fareway and Hy-Vee food store register slip can be used. Even slips from Hy-Vee Fast & Fresh (Gas), Coffee Shop, Food Service, and Pharmacy help us toward the goal. Delivery slips/sheets can also be used. Thanks to all who bring/mail the slips to the Church, or mailing them or dropping them off at my house. Even the very small amounts help.

Crisp Cucumber Salsa from Abigail Anderson

2 C. finely chopped seeded peeled cucumber
1/2 C. finely chopped seeded tomato
1/4 C. chopped red onion
2 Tbsp. minced fresh parsley
1 jalapeno pepper, seeded chopped
4-1/2 tsp. minced fresh cilantro
1 garlic clove minced
1/4 C. sour cream
1-1/2 tsp. lemon juice
1-1/2 tsp. lime juice
1/4 tsp. ground cumin
1/4 tsp. seasoned salt
Tortilla chips

In a small bowl, combine the first 7 ingredients. In another bowl, combine the remaining ingredients. Pour over cucumber mixture; toss gently to coat. Enjoy!
