Presidents Letter

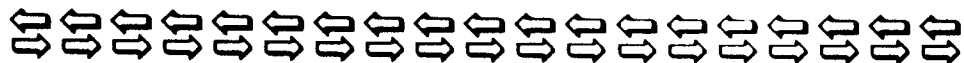

The Divisionals for those divisions which play on Wednesday will be held Saturday December 8 while those divisions which play on Thursday will be held Saturday December 15. Sign ups for all the divisionals will close at 3:30 pm at the location where your respective divisional is to be held.

I would also like to remind you that if you are planning to compete in the 1991 Winter Season you must submit an application to do so. Applications will be available and are to be received by the DDA before December 20. So get your application in early then enjoy the holidays and their festive times and as always, take care and enjoy yourselves.

chance of getting run through a few cycles.

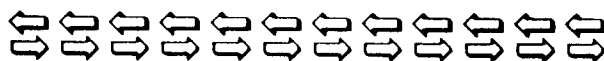
The bad news is that the smaller pages are not as good for use when you run out of toilet paper, but you do have more sheets!

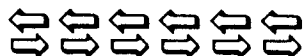

Games

Burma Road - Here is a game that is fun to play as a warm-up or just as a deviation on Cricket. Any number may play, from one on up.

Each player begins with 40 points. The first throw is at 20's. Any 20's hit are scored in the normal Cricket manner. If no 20's are hit, that player's score is halved.

The second throw is at 19's, with any hit scored normally and a miss halves the score. The third throw is at triples (any triple). The triple(s) hit are scored at point value (t16 = 48), and a miss halves the score.

This continues through 18's, 17's, then doubles. Followed by 16's, 15's and bulls.

The player with the highest score at the end wins. You can keep track of your highest score and shoot against that for practice, or you can shoot against another player.

But wait one moment, we did throw darts too! And several Dayton Darters were right there to show their stuff. Surprisingly the one who did the best isn't a DDA member this year. 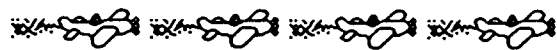
Ron Cloutier took top 8 in Open Doubles Cricket. But Ron wasn't finished there, he also took top 8 in Open Singles 501.

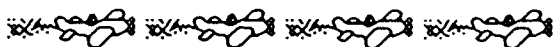
when you consider there were 796 entries in this event alone.

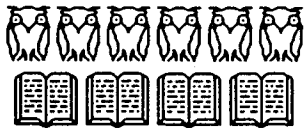
