Engineer Spotlight

What motivated you to offer Fountainhead Tower for a Good Bad and Ugly tour?

I feel that my building is somewhat unique as I have a mixture of manufacturer's equipment operating in the chiller plant. I have an old 1985 work horse Trane CVHE centrifugal chiller a seven year old York MaxE centrifugal chiller and an Automated Logic energy management system keeping the building comfortable.

Tell us about your chillers?

In the past couple of years I had a control panel upgrade performed on the Trane CVHE. Trane performed this factory upgrade with their Adaptiview control panel upgrade which has increased my ability to more accurately control this chiller. The York MaxE chiller utilizes drive technology making it a very efficient chiller operationally. We also had the chiller power transfer switch and the chilled and condenser water isolation valves automated so that throughout the year I can switch lead and lag on these chillers automatically to allow for equal wear and tear.

What other measures have you taken to increase the building's energy efficiency?

We have variable frequency drives on all of our air handlers and also the cooling tower fan motors. This helps us to save energy as the buildings demand fluctuates throughout the year. We also participate in the CPS demand response program.

Turning the Corner

Sometime in the last week or so it happened; summer finally decided it's ride had ended so look for it now in the rear view mirror. Temps which routinely broke into the high 90's and low hundreds now struggle to make it into the 80's (this is still south Texas after all) and there's even now actually a little chill in the morning air. After the record-breaking, stormy two month rainy spell from mid-April unto June, followed by your typical bone-dry, killer-hot summer, we've finally gotten over that hump. Winter's coming.

For the Building Engineer, it's time to start thinking less about the AC and more about the heat. Depending on your situation, that may mean several things. If you have heating boilers that have been off-line for the summer, now's the time to put a good pair of eyeballs on them. For the fewer and fewer of us that use steam for heat, you're also looking at maintenance on your steam traps and condensate pumps. With electric heat that's been dialed off, it's time is coming once again: be ready for the first time you fire them up and hear the complaints about "that burning smell" as the dust cooks off. If your building is capable of using the cold outside air for cooling (instead of chillers and compressors), the controls side is essential; you don't want your outside doors standing open two feet (positive building pressure) or sucking freezing air in (negative pressure) each time And there may be HVAC schedule the door opens. changes needed as it no longer takes as much time to cool the building down.

Daylight Savings Time ends Sunday morning at 2:00 am on November 1st. More and more the Building Automation Systems that we operate have these schedule changes built in; does yours? Any mechanical time clocks (and regular clocks) will need to be adjusted. Minimal systems to check include: HVAC, security and exterior lights; are you covered? And as the days get shorter, parking lot and exterior lights will need to run longer; if they are controlled by a photo cell- no problem. Some BAS will also follow a sunrise/sunset schedule (again no problem), but many are still as thick as a brick: you want the lights on at a certain time; you tell them to do it.

That's a start. Is it too early to think about freeze protection?

What is one accomplishment that gives you the most pride about your building?






