S. D. Junior Has 71, Just Misses Mark

IOWA CITY, IA.—Daven Hanten of Huron, S. D., cruised home with the qualifying medal in the Western Junior golf tournament Wednesday by a hefty three-stroke margin over the fastest field ever to play in this ancient event.

Hanten tacked on a steady 71 to the blazing 66 he posted Tuesday for a five-under-par total of 137, only one shot above the tourney's 36-hole qualifying record.

It took a 149 or better to enter match play starting today on the University of Iowa's south Pinkbine course—and that was a record. The previous low cutoff point was 150.

Six young shooters had to play off for the final three spots to make up a 32-man list of survivors who will collide in double rounds of match play today and Friday, leading to an 18-hole title match Saturday morning.

Greg Pitzer, runner-up in last year's Western Junior, held the hot hand in Wednesday's firing with a 63 that earned him a share of second place at 140. Pitzer, from Westwood Village, Calif., was five under par until he ran into a double-bogey 6 on the fourteenth hole.

Matching his 149 total was Ken Backus of South Fort Mitchell, Ky., who shot a second straight one-under 70.

Four Iowans moved along into the championship bracket—Al Bailey of Cedar Rapids; Jim Carney of Centerville, and Dubuque's Roger Puls and Bob Mulert.

Two other Iowans, Ty Borman of Council Bluffs and John Jacobs IV of Cedar Rapids, were sidelined in the six-way sudden-death playoff among the 149 shooters. Borman went out with a bogey on the first hole, and Jacobs was the last to be eliminated when he bogeyed No. 5 just before dark.

Ron Benson of St. Paul, Minn., and former National Junior champion Don Iverson of La Crosse, Wis., trailed the three leaders in a deadlock at 141, followed by Mike Taylor of Meridian, Miss., at even-par 142. Then came Chris Scena of Denver, Colo., last year's medalist, in a tie with Drue Johnson of Paris, Ill., at 143. Bailey headed the remaining Iowa contenders in ninth place
