



San Mateo Coastside Emergency Corps

The Coastside Emergency Corps (CEC) is soliciting volunteers to serve as members of the Board of Directors for 2020. The CEC is a 501(3)c volunteer organization dedicated to bringing together emergency response volunteers on the San Mateo Coastside for coordination, communication and training. There are currently six volunteer organizations affiliated with the CEC, known as 'Standing Committees': Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT), Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES), Large Animal Evacuation Group (LAEG), Peninsula Humane Society (PHS), Disaster Airlift Response Team (DART), and Emergency Shelter Operations.

Qualifications:

Anyone with an interest in playing an active role in preparing the San Mateo Coastside for disasters is welcome to apply. Applicants affiliated with one or more of the CEC Standing Committees or any other group involved in volunteer emergency response (CEAP, for example) are particularly encouraged to apply. We would also like to have representation on the Board from as many regions of the Coastside as possible, from the Tom Lantos Tunnels to the Santa Cruz County line, and east to Skyline Blvd.

Responsibilities:

The CEC Board of Directors is responsible for ensuring the volunteer emergency response teams on the Coastside are prepared to respond to emergencies by setting goals, developing protocols, planning training opportunities, providing community outreach, and establishing and maintaining relationships with local, state and federal emergency organization leadership, as appropriate. The Board is also responsible for maintaining all paperwork and accounts associated with the 501(3)c. The Board meets monthly and holds general meetings quarterly.

Potential candidates for the CEC Board of Directors are invited to submit an application (attached) to the CEC Nominating Committee: barrj@stanford.edu. The Nominating Committee will review the applications and forward them to the 2019 Board of Directors, who will vote for candidates at the October Board meeting.
