LAST MEETING

Lion Ron started the meeting by welcoming our guests. He brought Casey Dill, who is the Field Manager and Director of Operations for the Palm Springs Power Baseball organization.

First Vice District Governor Mike Jones also visited us to present the Community Impact Award for Southern California. This was given to us by the Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation at their gala.

Because our speakers were from PSUSD, Lion Ron regaled them with a short history of our work in helping the schools by providing eye exams and glasses since 1938. Joan Boiko introduced the new Superintendent, Sandra Lyon. She has just arrived from the Santa Monica-Malibu School District where she served as the Superintendent for the past five years. She is in her 28th year of education and has served at all levels of teaching and administration.

Our main speaker was Karen Cornett, who has been with the District most of her career as teacher, administrator, and now as School Board member.

Karen outlined the current status of the schools: twenty-nine elementary, five middle, four high, two alternative schools, and one virtual school. These schools serve a total of 23,000 students, 76% of whom are Hispanic.

This makes the District the largest employer in the West Valley.

Because of a successful bond vote, the District has been able to embark on many projects, including building new schools and renovating others. The auditorium at PSHS has been fully renovated, and the dedication is October 26th.

The bond, as Measure I, is up for renewal in the upcoming election. It will reauthorize \$216.46 million of previously approved Measure E bonds.

The District policy of open enrollment allows students to enter the high school that has his or her Academy, whether it be medicine, solar energy, or hospitality.
