Sacred Silence

I thought it would be appropriate to revisit some of our liturgical commitments that we have made now that we have had several weeks to experience them. I am very happy with how things are going. I invite you to go constantly deeper into the mystery of the mass. I think a good place to begin is with silence.

I would particularly like to highlight the importance of a time of Sacred Silence after Communion. We have identified the time between the last person receiving the Eucharist and when the Priest stands to offer the Prayer After Communion. This is a time for everyone to enter into thoughtful prayer. Everyone should take part in this. Music is not played and the choir is not preparing the missioning hymn. The ushers are not getting the bulletins ready. The first people to receive Communion have not finished their prayers and are going through their purse to find their keys and discussing where to go for coffee.

Whether you sit, stand or kneel after Communion is an issue that I have heard the Archbishop will address with the introduction of the new French edition of the Roman Missal during Advent. Please don't feel I am forcing you to stand. We recommend that everyone stand until everyone has received. Whichever posture you choose; sitting, standing or kneeling, I ask that you maintain that posture to avoid any noisy disturbance during our time of Sacred Silence. I believe this guidance is in tune with the General Instruction of the Roman Missal as the following expresses.

"Silence 45. Sacred silence also, as part of the celebration, is to be observed at the designated times. Its nature, however, depends on the moment when it occurs in the different parts of the celebration. For in the Penitential Act and again after the invitation to pray, individuals recollect themselves; whereas after a reading or after the Homily, all meditate briefly on what they have heard; then after Communion, they praise God in their hearts and pray to him. Even before the celebration itself, it is a praiseworthy practice for silence to be observed in the church, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred celebration in a devout and fitting manner."

I hope this is helpful. *Father Angus*

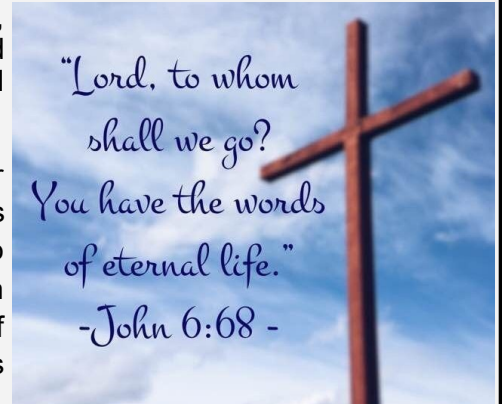

"Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (Jn 6: 68).

4. "Lord, to whom shall we go?". The goal and target of our life is he, the Christ, who awaits us — each one singly and all together — to lead us across the boundaries of time to the eternal embrace of the God who loves us.

But if eternity is our horizon as people starving for truth and thirsting for happiness, *history is the setting of our daily commitment*. Faith teaches us that man's destiny is written in the heart and mind of God, who directs the course of history. It also teaches us that the Father puts in our hands the task of beginning to build here on earth the "kingdom of heaven" which the Son came to announce and which will find its fulfilment at the end of time.



It is our duty then to live in history, side by side with our peers, sharing their worries and hopes, because the Christian is and must be fully a man of his time. He cannot escape into another dimension, ignoring the tragedies of his era, closing his eyes and heart to the anguish that pervades life. On the contrary, it is he who, although not "of" this world, is immersed "in" this world every day, ready to hasten to wherever there is a brother in need of help, a tear to be dried, a request for help to be answered. On this will we be judged!

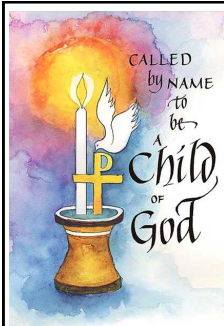

5. Remembering the Master's warning: "I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me" (Mt 25:35-36), we must put the "new commandment" into practice (Jn 13:34).

Thus we will oppose what today seems to be the "disintegration of civilization", in order vigorously to reaffirm the "civilization of love" which alone can open to the men of our time horizons of true peace and lasting justice in lawfulness and solidarity.

Charity is also the high road that must lead us to the goal of the Great Jubilee. To reach this appointment, we need to be able to confront ourselves and undertake a rigorous examination of conscience, the indispensable premiss for a radical conversion, which can transform our life and give it an authentic meaning which enables believers to love God with all their heart, with all their soul and with all their strength, and to love their neighbour as themselves (cf. Lk 10:27).

By conforming your daily life to the Gospel of the one Teacher who has "the words of eternal life", you will be able to become genuine workers for justice, following the commandment which makes love the new "frontier" of Christian witness. This is the law for transforming the world (cf. *Gaudium et spes*, n. 38).

Save the Date! Tending the Soil, Tending the Sower, 2021

This year's catechists' formation takes place on September 18th at Immaculate Heart of Mary Church, Riverview beginning at 8:30 a.m. and finishing by 2:00 pm. The province of New Brunswick has moved to the Green level. This allows us to remove some restrictions in our churches. We will have to continue to be careful as Covid-19 is always with us. We are encouraged to practice health measures such as handwashing, coughing in your elbow, or staying home when sick and wearing a mask if you so choose. The virus is still with us and we should all expect to see cases as normal travel returns.

You are no longer required to call and register for Mass. You may enter and seat yourself. Masks are no longer mandatory but we respect those who choose to wear them for health or safety reasons. Physical distancing is not required, thus, the church can be filled. Singing may resumed as before Covid-19 without restriction. Parish gatherings and catechetical groups may now be held without restriction as to number and distance.

The following restrictions are to be maintained: Holy Communion: For the time being, as a matter of prudence, we will refrain from distributing communion in the cup or receiving on the tongue. The sign of peace will be exchanged by bowing or making other gestures without contact.

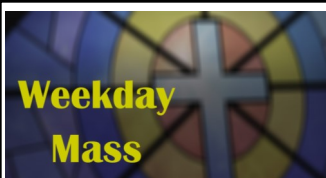
