He Is My Brother

A distinguished clergyman was once vacationing in a Christian home in a neighboring city. The home consisted of a devoted husband, a faithful wife, and two loving children—a little girl seven years old, and a little boy of four. During his stay in this model home, the minister noticed how attentive this little girl always seemed to be toward her little brother. She would carry him over the rough places in the lawn where they played, hold him in her lap when he would get sleepy, and always seemed so interested in his comfort and welfare.

One of these errands of helpfulness so attracted the minister that he said to her, "He is very heavy for you, is he not, sister?" "No! he is not heavy," replied the little girl. "He is my brother."

This application of this little girl's philosophy of life is the heart and soul of the Gospel of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. One is your Master even Christ and all ye are brethren. Heavy loads and hard tasks are made easy, only as we are moved by a sincere and devoted love for the brethren. Let us not strive, "for we be brethren."

At the heart of the gospel lies the fact that the Spirit founds life in love, therefore it brings unity and produces brotherhood. It is perhaps the tragedy of the centuries, that the gospel that was intended to unite, to heal, to produce a brotherhood, to make the world one, has so often been so changed that, in fact, it has been used to divide, to wound, to produce innumerable sects, and to make the world more disrupted than ever. Selfishness is the poison used in this program of suicide, and the little girl's attitude, "He is not heavy because he is my brother," is not only the cue to happiness but it is also the cure for selfishness. No one can contribute to the hurt of a brother without destroying himself. Selfishness will rot in his own hands somewhere down the line.

When brotherly love is lacking, the cause is always clearly stated, in the scriptures; and the cure amply provided for. The cause of the first clash between the disciples was their self-assertive attitude toward life. They did not sense the fact that Christ's greatest glory was not in His miracles, but in laying down His life—in self-giving. They understood not this saying because it is a spiritual attitude involving more than an intellectual act. So there arose a reasoning among them who should be greatest. Christian worker was clashing with Christian worker. Many of our church problems today start here. One Christian worker, realizing how difficult it was to get along with his colleague, at the close of a vacation, wired him as follows: "Be much in prayer, I'm coming home." It would be easy to be a Christian worker if we could be alone. But we are compelled to be related to others, and a Christian is one who gets along

SANCTIFIED BODIES

This is one subject that is not preached very often, and not many seek to receive it, yet we feel it is taught in the Word of God as much as sanctification of the soul of man. Many have lost the vision and how necessary it is to have a sanctified body. Let us look into the scriptures from God's word. In Proverbs 4: 20-23—"My son, attend to my words, incline thine ear unto my saying. Let them not depart from thine eyes, keep them in the midst of thine heart. For they are life to those that find them and health to all their flesh." Here we find if we heed God's word and incline our ears unto His sayings, it will be life to us and health to our bodies. Also in Prov. 3: 5-8, we find God promises us, "Health to thy navel and marrow to our bones."

Also in Jer. 17:14—we find that if God is able to save us and keep us saved He will also heal us and keep us healed. Surely if the sacrifice of the Son of God is able to save the soul of man, the same sacrifice and broken body will heal our bodies and keep us in health, even as He saves us and His grace keeps us saved.

Romans 12: 1-2, Paul writes to the Christians and calls them brethren, "I beseech you therefore brethren by the mercies of God that you present your bodies (not our souls but our bodies) a living sacrifice, holy acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service." In this first verse we find Paul deals with the body of man and not the soul. Paul tells us we should present our bodies a living sacrifice Holy to God. Then in the second verse, Paul deals with the soul of man, telling us not to conform to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of our minds, that we may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God. In 1 Thess. 4: 3 and 4, Paul tells us it is God's will even your sanctification, that ye shall abstain from fornication, that every one of you should know how to possess his vessel (our body) in sanctification and in honor. Surely it pleases God for our bodies as well as our soul to be sanctified. 1 Thess. 5: 23-24, "And the very God of Peace sanctify you WHOLLY, and I pray God your WHOLE spirit and soul, and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of the Lord." "Faithful is he that calleth you who also will do it." In these scrip-

tures we find that our WHOLE body is to be sanctified, wholly. He separates the spirit, soul and body showing that each one is to be sanctified, the body as well as the soul. I Cor. 6: 19-20, Paul tells us our body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in us which we have of God and we are not our own but are bought with a price. Therefore we are to glorify God in our bodies, how can we glorify God in our bodies if there is sickness and disease reigning. Again in Eph. 5: 29-30, we find no man hateth his own flesh, but nourisheth and cherisheth it even as the Lord cares for the church. For we are members of His Body, of His flesh, and of His bones. If we are Christ's body and of His bone and flesh how we, as God's children, need to seek and strive to obtain a sanctified body that we might have well and strong bodies.

In Phil. 3: 21, Christ shall change our vile body that it may be fashioned like unto His glorious body. Christ had a perfect body here on earth and it's our privilege to have the same through His broken body. We are not trying to do away with Divine Healing, it is wonderful when we are sick, our bodies racked with pain and fevered brow for God to reach down and touch us, yet there is a more excellent way, if God can heal our bodies, He is able to keep us in Health.

We teach sanctification of soul as grace to overcome sin and help us live a Christian life even so we preach sanctified body as a step to keep us above disease. Joel 3: 21, "I will cleanse their blood that I have not cleansed if we have clean blood or pure blood, it will fight off disease, so we will not be taking even disease we come in contact with. We will be tried on a sanctified body, even as we are tried on a sanctified soul, God said he would have a tried people. But every time we have ache or pain is no reason we have lost this experience but are merely being tried to see if we will resist even as we have to resist sin. Third John 1: 2, God says, "Beloved, I will be above all things that thou mayst prosper and be in health, even as thy Soul prospereth. So will ask how do we receive this blessing? Presenting our bodies a living sacrifice, Holy acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. God does not require anything unreasonable of his children. Rom. 12: 1-2, It is the only way we can receive a sanctified s

and body is to present our **bodies** a living sacrifice to God, therefore it is impossible for us to receive a sanctified soul without receiving a sanctified body at the same time. For it is our bodies we present to God in order to receive a sanctified soul. When God sanctified our soul he sanctified our body and our spirit, as Paul tells us in I Thess. 5: 23-24. Remember man consists of three things, spirit, soul and body. Paul says God will sanctify our whole body. So if we do not honor His blood to cleanse our bodies when we receive a sanctified soul, then it is necessary for us to come before God again in prayer and honor His blood to cleanse our body.

The above heading may seem to be a pertinent question, but every one should be able to answer it in the affirmative, for if we do not tithe we are in a way robbing God, for it is simply a debt we owe Him and surely God SHOULD be first in everything.

The writer took up this blessed tithing system over a quarter of a century ago and I can gladly testify that I am so in love with the plan that I would not think of advising anyone to do otherwise.

I had quite a surprise in this connection quite recently. A friend who had been reading up on the subject (a splendid thing to do) got under conviction not only to pay his tithe, but also to pay up his back tithing, which he figured out to amount to \$2,556.

He had quite a talk with me about the matter and decided to commence and pay up just as he could spare the money, and to show his good faith he paid in several dollars in just a few days. Could you see his smiling face you would soon decide that he was not sorry for the step he had taken. He reported to me later that he had been blessed in making several sales in a very short time, and that it seemed that God was helping him, then to show his sincerity and earnestness, he paid in \$15 more. A splendid example.

There is one thing ABSOLUTELY SURE—and that is, that we cannot outgive God — it makes no difference, whether it be money, time or talents. He will more than amply repay us.

Friend: Have you been robbing God all these years? See Mal. 3: 8. If so, right about face and try this plan of paying God His due, and just see how it works. I feel sure that every honest soul who tries this plan, will never want to go back into the robbing business again.

It is a very common thing for persons who do not tithe, to say with quite a degree of animation, "Oh! I pay more than a tenth," or "Everything I have belongs to God"; but then the truly honest way is to keep books with the Lord, so to speak, or at least to take out one-tenth of all increase as soon as it comes in—it is a safer plan.

THE DEAD SEA

The Dead Sea is about fifteen miles from Jerusalem. This remarkable lake is forty-seven miles long, and its greatest width is ten miles. It is 1292 feet below the level of the Mediterranean Sea; and is therefore, the deepest natural depression. The area is approximately 300 square miles, and its depth 1300 feet. The name Salt Sea or Dead Sea has been given it because it is so salty that little animal or plant life is able to exist in it. One-fifth of the weight of the water consists of dissolved matter. Thus, if five pounds of the water are evaporated, a pound of salt is obtained. The water of the Dead Sea is eight times saltier than ocean water. Because of the high temperature of the desert air, evaporation is rapid. Therefore, the salt is easily recovered. In the sun, the temperature of the water rises to 167

"The gross amount of brine in the Dead Sea is about 370 billion tons, of which about one-fifth or 74 billion tons is dissolved matter. The quantities of the different salts may be computed from the percentages given above. Sodium chloride is quoted around \$2.90 a ton, potassium chloride \$20, calcium chloride \$18, magnesium chloride at \$20 a ton and bromide at about twenty cents a pound, wholesale."

The Value of the Dead Sea

The value of the 74 billion tons of salt may be easily understood by the following chart:
