Meeting called to order at 7:00 P.M. Via Zoom Internet

Members present: Dale Pomerleau, Blair Bollig, Dave Gerold and Peter Trence, Jerome Bokelmann called the meeting to order and conducted the board members in accordance with the duties of the board to meet in the monthly scheduled meeting.

Secretary's report: The President asked if there were any corrections or additions to the report for the February printed copy of the minutes. Club Project: 1930 State Patrol Model A

Our Club Project

Our club, the Twin Cities Model A Ford Club (TCMAFC) started working on an interesting group restoration project in November.

The Minnesota State Patrol Troopers Association owns a 1930 Coupe patrol car that is trailered to car shows, swap meets, parades and other activi-

ties. They display the Model A plus a motorcycle and a modern trooper car at our annual Fall Midwest Antique Car Show and Swap Meet on the Minnesota State Fairgrounds each year. This last year, they also presented a trophy for the best show car of their choice.

Werner Langenbach, our clinic coordinator met

two troopers last spring at a local restoration show, where our club also had a display. They had a leaking gas gauge and asked if it could be fixed. They were referred to Werner because he had just put on a restoration seminar on the subject.

Later, Werner received a call from Eddie Carroll, one of the troopers. Eddie asked if our club would help with a complete restoration of the patrol car to it's original state, including appropriate lights and sirens.

The project would include complete chassis restoration of all mechanical parts, upholstery, radiator, and top. The body work and painting would be completed by someone else with the Trooper's Association handling that part of it. Members of

the club would volunteer the labor with the Trooper's Association paying for all the parts.

Werner presented the idea to the board of directors at the next board meeting and after some discussion, they voted to approve the project.

When the project was presented to the member-

ship, they were very enthusiastic and about forty members immediately volunteered. Another member of the club, Dick Punchard, volunteered his place of business as the site for the project.

In early November we had a meeting to discuss job assignments and a schedule was agreed on. On a Thursday evening, November 14th, seven volunteers removed the interior and top material in prepa-

During the month of January, restored assemblies started filtering back into the shop. Also, new parts ordered from a number of vendors had to be unpacked, inventoried, and sorted. Saturday, January 11th a team gathered for another day of assembling the chassis. Bruce Remington, our motor rebuild expert, arrived with the biggest piece, the motor. All of the volunteers found work installing the motor, assembling the brakes and putting the axels in place. Ed Carroll and John Mock arrived to see how things were going and take some more pictures. They introduced Mary Schrader, the Trooper's Association Secretary/Treasurer, to the group. Mary seemed very interested in the work being done. Mary, by the way, is the one who writes the checks to reimburse the club. All the while, club member Eldon Frisk was busy getting it all on video tape.

By February the chassis was complete with only some final touches being done. The brakes were adjusted, the steering restoration was finished and the steering assembly was installed, and the front fenders and splash aprons were fitted by Charlie Wienke and John Moore prior to going to the painter.

The following Monday Dave and Neal Anderson met at dick's shop and completed the wiring and then Tuesday evening, with Bruce Remington present and Dick Punchard doing the honors, the motor was started for the first time. Thanks Bruce for an excellent job on the motor. Werner and Gordy took it out for a test drive of 1 mile.

As members filtered in to Dick's shop from Jan and Werner's coffee social some of the last minute details were taken care of and on the afternoon of April 12th the patrol car was officially returned to the Minnesota State Trooper's Association.

I was thinking of planning two tours for the summer of 2024. But before I would put all the work into the planning, I'm looking for members who may have interest and contact me.


#1 tour would be to SW Minnesota. It would be around 3 days (2 nights) outing. From the Wayzata a round trip of about 400-500 Miles

March Clinic

We gathered this night again in challenging weather conditions which may have caused some people to stay home. We are zooming the clinics and hope on occasions like this night or if for some reason your not able to get out we have you join us on your computer.

Dave Gerold steped up this night and brought in a front axle. While the axle usually is suspect for warn out things like king pins, perch housings, the subject was to the very starting point of an axle restoration. Step one is to question is the axle straight? bent? twisted? Dave guided us through how he inspects for these conditions through the use of some machined shafts he made and inserted into the bored holes in the axle and the use of a known flat surface, some measuring tools and a careful visual stare down of his machined shafts in the bored holes in the axle. These shafts should all be in line with one another on the same planes. The spatial relationships should also show consistentancy when comparing left side to the right side. After he determined the axle needed to be to be straightened, we saw a video he shot in his shop using a hydraulic press, pressing on some predetermined spots he mapped out on the inspection he preformed earlier. After a number of pressings the axle rebounded back to a straight and true axle. Dave used the shafts he machined and measurements to determine the axle was again true.
