TRAGEDIES



Recent news of the tragedies in Uvalde, TX (19 children and two students killed in a mass shooting at an elementary school) and Buffalo, NY (10 black people killed at a grocery store in a racially-motivated mass shooting) – each at the hands of a lone gunman – hits us at the core of our being and at the heart of our faith. These are just two of what have become all too frequent occurrences of violence in our country. If you're like me, you've felt anger, shock, horror, disbelief, sadness, and grief. We have questions for which there are no earthly answers, and we are shaken...and we are not betraying our faith by feeling these things.

But I must also affirm that nothing happens without God's knowledge and without His presence. To those who ask "Why did God allow these things to happen?" – I would reply that God allows freedom of choice. In each case, that choice led one, judgmental person to perpetrate a crime with tragic results. And to those who ask "Where was God in the midst of these horrors?" – I would reply with great confidence that God WAS there to reassure those who were fatally shot as they drew their last breath; He was there to envelope them in His loving arms and make the terrors of this world go away. God was there with the wounded at those scenes as they prayed not to die and as they ultimately were cared for by those close by and by first responders.

And God is still present...with the families and friends of those whose loved ones and friends are among the fatalities; with the wounded who continue to heal physically and who may never fully heal emotionally; with those close to the wounded who offer support and care; with the first responders who undoubtedly witnessed horrific scenes; with the citizens of our nation and of the world who grieve for these people and for all the victims of intolerance, violence, and terrorism; with all who struggle in trying to make sense out of senseless situations. I hope that you will join me in praying for these people and for all those, ourselves included, who seek God's help in sorting through these tragedies.

Psalm 46 says: "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Be still and know that I am God. The Lord Almighty is with us, the God of Jacob is our fortress."

This is the God to Whom we turn. This is the God to Whom we draw close in worship each week and in prayer each day. This is the God in Whom we find meaning in the midst of senselessness and Who assures triumph in the midst of tragedy.

Jesus himself – our crucified, resurrected, ascended, and living Saviour – is our example in all these things. Let us be thankful that he comes to us still, especially in moments of national or personal tragedy. And let us truly say: blessed is he who ultimately brings peace to our troubled world and lives; blessed is he who comes when we need him most.

CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS

June 13, 2022

- Deacons are recommending using Earl's Mechanical to install a hot water heat heating system in the church at a cost of \$165,000. The vote was unanimous to accept the Deacons' recommendation to take to the Congregation for vote.
- Congregational Meeting will be held on July 10 to present this recommendation. Informational sessions will be offered on June 26 and July 3 to answer questions and hear concerns.
- Money has been transferred and paperwork submitted on June 9 to finalize purchase of the land adjacent to the parking lot. Closing was done on June 10 for the farm land that was purchased.

Her low-impact routines are ideally suited to those who may not be able to stand for long periods of time during a fitness regimen, those who prefer not to be completely upright for an exercise session, and/ or those who simply want to supplement other types of workouts with this focus on arms, shoulders, and abs. It's a perfect exercise class for seniors, those just starting an exercise routine, those with balance issues, those recovering from an injury or surgery (with doctor's permission), or anyone who needs a very low impact, adjustableintensity workout. The precise intensity is up to the participant.

A variety of equipment will be used, but attendees will need to bring their own hand weights – 1-3 pounds are recommended.

This workout combines cardio, strength, and flexibility, all modified to a seated position.

Benefits

- · Allows you to stay active and independent.
- Decreases risk of injury.
- Improves balance and coordination.
- Maintains muscular strength.
- Enhances flexibility.
- Develops a more functional body.

Knueve and Sons will be working on the project as soon as the equipment arrives. Thank you also to Holgate Lumber and Buckeye Building for underwriting the cost of replacing the four windows in the offices! That was another welcome and generous surprise.

Earl Mechanical will be doing the work to install the air conditioning units in Fellowship Hall. They will begin working as soon as the equipment arrives.

There will be a Special Congregational Meeting on July 10 to decide whether we replace the current boilers with a closed loop hot water system or boilers similar to what we currently have. You should have received a letter outlining the recommendation from Consistory. There will be informational meetings after church on June 26 and July 3 as it is important that people be informed.
