Jacob True (1748-1826) P-307382

Private, Captain Ebenezer Webster's company

Jacob True was born on March 26, 1748, in Pembroke, New Hampshire, a son of Deacon Ezekial True and his wife Mary (Morrill). He married Lydia Dow on April 6, 1773, location unknown. They had five children: Daniel, Ezekial, Jacob Jr., John, and Lydia.

True demonstrated his dedication to the patriot cause by becoming an Association Test signer for the state of New Hampshire. He also performed military service as a private in Captain Ebenezer Webster's company. They were known to have fought in the Battle of Bennington, Vermont, on Aug. 16, 1777. It is unknown if he was a pensioner.

True died on Sept. 2, 1826 in Salisbury, New Hampshire. He is buried in Shaw Corner Cemetery in Franklin, New Hampshire, Merrimack County. His grave is honored with a Patriot Marker, installed in May 2015 by descendant Craig Paige.
