This fall the library started its first Annual Giving Campaign to help continue to offer a wide variety of programs, help with operational expenses, and to develop new programs as needs and interests are identified. 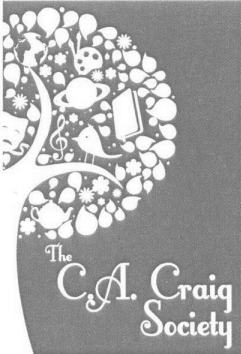

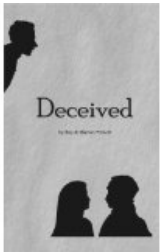

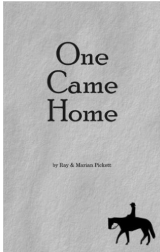

- Harvest – Reaping the benefits... literally!

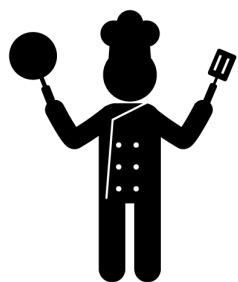
