# Call to Order

## **Staff Reports:**

PARK: Park manager, Ron Fjerkenstad, reported on park activities:

- Received a thank-you for supporting the Canby Sportsman's Club.
- Discussed a possible ½ acre food plot on the Boy Scout campsite area of the park.
- The park opened on May 1 and water and power are on. They had one leak and had to replace one toilet. They will work on the roads when the weather allows.
- They took the park cart to Hendricks to fix the brakes, and have a tune-up. We are using a loaner until it is complete.
- Mitch Enderson asked to pick-up some hours working at the park a couple week nights and weekends. Ron requested to start him at \$10.25/hour. The Board gave their approval.

# **DRAINAGE MANAGER/INSPECTOR:** Jared Roiland reported on monthly activities.

- Attended the viewer's seminar on April 4, 2019 where the main topic discussed was how to determine outlet fees and benefits.
- Attended the LQP NRCS/SWCD local work group meeting.
- We held the pre-construction meeting for the CD #54 improvement on April 23, 2019.
- Met with the LQP SWCD to discuss buffer enforcement/maintenance.
- Attended the LQP-YB WRAPS meeting on April 30, 2019.
- Darrel and I were out five days locating sloughing in ditch systems for state flooding relief, as well as inspecting reported maintenance orders.
- Submitted the 1-rod easement claims for CD 12 landowners.
- Prepared the monthly drainage report for the Commissioners.
- Continue entering data into drainage DB to keep it up-to-date and started taking pictures of the ditch maps & profiles to see if pictures will work.
- We received the preliminary engineers report on the CD #42 improvement and are waiting on DNR comments.

## **COORDINATOR:** Coordinator Mitch Enderson reported on monthly activities.

- Eighty-three ditch system centerlines have been completed for the Drainage grant.
- Started testing out taking pictures of plans/profiles. This has been delayed recently with the rush in the office picking up.
- The January –March DRM grant request and budget was submitted to the County. A request for the next 40% of the DRM grant was submitted to the State with eLINK reporting and funding was received by the County.
- Held a WRAPS meeting on April 30<sup>th</sup> for local partners to listen to reports generated by State agency staff on Watershed Pollutant Load Monitoring Network, Stressor Identification Report, and the DNR Watershed

Characterization Report, highlighting the geomorphology and hydrology characteristics in the Watershed. Trudy & I also attended a similar meeting for the Upper MN River Watershed on the 24th.

- Planning the annual canoe trip to be on June 14th. This date also works with Greg Wyum for the canoes. I will be scoping out a few different sites the latter part of May.
- Working on some content for the interpretive signs, including messing around with some 3D modeling that is visually neat.
- January-March WRAPS voucher request was submitted and approved. We will only see 90% of our requests now, and the 10% retainage from the requests will be submitted to us at the end of WRAPS.
- We have five or six inquiries for SSTS with only one application so far in 2019.
- The Del Clark/Canby Creek grant agreement was submitted and the grant is executed and we have received the first 50% of the funding.
- Working on a cooperation agreement for the Canby Creek grant to review and put in place for us with Lincoln and Yellow Medicine SWCDs.
- Trudy and I attended Area II on May 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2019.
- Reapplied for the GIS conservation grant and extended my Arc licensing for another year for \$400. The quote we got without the grant to extend for a year was \$6,000.
- There has been some renewed talk within DNR about a potential Florida Creek reroute to its natural channel. Jon Lore, DNR discussed the project prior to our WRAPS meeting. Sounds like most of the surveying is done and they are hoping to get out on the land and inspect this summer.

#### WCA - Coordinator Mitch Enderson

- HRM bank inquired about credit release approval. The sponsor submitted a form and it was signed by the TEP and returned for the sponsor to submit to St. Paul. This is a 20% release of 2.35 credits for hydrology standards.
- Submitted an amendment from the USFWS to the bank plan to the TEP for comment and will have that to the board at our next meeting.
- I will be attending a two day training May 21-22 at Sherburne National Wildlife Refuge.
- Reviewed the watershed permits for WCA along with various landowner questions.

<u>Treasurers Report:</u> Manager Ludvigson read the Treasurer's report.

At the regular May, 2019 meeting conducted by the Lac qui Parle-Yellow Bank Watershed District, sitting as the drainage authority for the improvement for County Ditch #42, Manager David Ludvigson moved, seconded by Manager Craigmile for adoption of the following Findings and Order:

#### FINDINGS:

1. Lac qui Parle-Yellow Bank Watershed District is the drainage authority for the improvement of County Ditch #42.

- 2. On November 19, 2018, a petition for improvement to County Ditch #42 was received by the drainage authority.
- 3. On December 4, 2018, the drainage authority adopted findings and an order accepting the petition and appointing Houston Engineering as the project engineer.
- 4. The preliminary engineer's report was filed with the watershed administrator on April 8, 2019.
- 5. Pursuant to Minn. Stat 103E.261, subd.1, a public hearing must be noticed by mail to petitioners, owners of property, and political subdivisions likely to be affected by the proposed drainage project.

#### Order:

- A. A hearing on the preliminary engineer's report shall be set for June 13, 2019 at 10:00 a.m. at the Lac qui Parle County Courthouse, 600 6th Street, Madison, MN in the Commissioners Room.
- B. At least ten days before the hearing, the secretary shall mail notice of the time and location of the hearing to petitioners, owners of property, and political subdivisions likely to be affected by the proposed drainage project in the preliminary survey report.
