Ongoing Formation of the Council: From the USCCB document, "Go and Make Disciples" – Chapter 2, Part 1: What is Evangelization? Part 2 next meeting. Review of the Minutes: Forgot to include Margery Fabilli as Absent/Excused. The rest of the minutes were approved.

Ongoing Parish Issues

- A. Issues for discernment/consensus (Old Business)
- 1. Parish Synod: November 18, 19, 20, 2016: "Unleash the Gospel:" Fr. Nick explained why Parish Rep Suzanne Druzynski could not attend. Although he asked the Chairperson of the Synod 2016 Committee to send him future information, he was told simply to consult the A o D website!
- 2. Status on Pictorial Directory and Welcome Booklet: First galley copy of the pictorial directory is being proofread. Welcome booklet is still a work in progress.
- 3. The Journey to My Vocation Fr. Nick, Sr. Pat (Deacon Marion?): Tabled until after Lent. There are two Lenten programs scheduled: Jeff Cavin's Bible Study on Wednesday of Lent at 1:00 PM and a review of the papal encyclical on the environment, "Laudato Si" on Thursdays of Lent at 7:00 p.m.
- 4. "Stump the Priest" Catholic Q and A: "Why Do Catholics...?" Still in the running; still need to select a date and a venue sometime after Lent.
- 5. "Called by Christ, Gifted by the Spirit" Stewardship Awareness Program: Fr. Nick will begin his presentations via Sunday homily, bulletin articles and pamphlets. Looking for parishioners to come forward to give witness to lives of stewardship.
- 6. Parish Bible study options: historical/exegetical/pastoral-spiritual: Little Rock, Renew, Alpha. Some interest in continuing the discussion group on Mary. See above notes. Fr. Nick passed on to Maribeth and Margery two possible Bible Study series. The sets can be ordered on a trial basis so they can be evaluated as appropriate.

7. Amazing Parish Follow-up: Nothing has been done with this since three staff members and two parishioners attended last April. Fr. Nick will take this to the pastoral team for follow-up.

B. Issues for discernment/consensus (New Business)

- 1. Homily for 4 Sunday January 29, 2017: Fr. Nick received a lot of positive feedback on his homily detailing his vision, hopes and dreams for the current year at St. Martin de Porres Parish. The content of the homily was so full, that the printed homily had to be re-read several times to appreciate the fullness of its message. It is ambitious, and does not cover all needs, but it is enough to fill the current year.
- 2. Any other New Business? Questions were asked if the pre-Synod experiences will be repeated post-Synod: Parish dialogue sessions, Salt and Light, Come, Encounter Christ, Awaken, etc. Fr. Nick does not know of any plans for these to continue post-Synod. A suggestion was made to continue these experiences. We will wait until Archbishop Vigneron announces his Post-Synod plans on Pentecost Sunday.

Open Forum/Upcoming Events/FYI: A parishioner, Kathy Forth, has suggested three web sites for folks to subscribe to. From Dynamic Catholic: Best Lent Ever; the Catechism in a Year; A Pope a Day. Fr. Nick will ask Kathy to join our committee.

Opening Prayer/Faith/Sharing Experience: The meeting began at 1:32 PM with a reflection on upcoming Easter Sunday Gospel: "Unbelievable Good News."

Attendance and Review of the Minutes: Members PRESENT: Fr. Nick Zukowski, Pastor and Chair; Jerry Cipkowski, Bill Edwards, Mike Garcia and Larry Lage. ABSENT/EXCUSED: Mike Kostrzeba. Minutes were approved with the capitalization of Bill Edward's first name.

Ongoing Education and Formation of the Council

"Go and Make Disciples: A Pastoral Letter on Evangelization" Section 5: Our Goals. We need to evangelize ourselves before we can evangelize others.

Ongoing Parish Finance Issues

- **A.** Issues for discernment/consensus (Old Business)
- 1. Review monthly reports, review and approve budget for FY 2017-2018: We are grateful for the extensive monthly reports Dawn Peters sends us. Discussion on whether we should present a "floating budget" vs. only the Sunday collection support report. We will continue "as is."
- 2. "Called by Christ, Gifted by the Spirit" stewardship awareness update: Fr. Nick gave a series of homilies during the Sundays of Lent that focused on Christian Stewardship: What is it? How does it affect my state in life? How does it impact my family? What should my financial and material sacrifice be? And how do I live out my call in service and ministry? People have expressed gratitude for this "teachable moment."
- 3. "Changing Lives Together" Parish Center storage addition: Storage area on the west end of the parish center. Two bids were received -- \$108,000 and \$152,000. Both were considered too high. Other options will be explored. We also need to know what city building codes will allow us to do. We might enclose the inner garden patio surrounding the parish center hall, and use that for the storage area.
- 4. Church sound system: Bill Edwards and Larry Lage: Delivery date for the new speakers is April 12th. We will wait until after Easter Sunday to install the equipment. Still need to purchase an iPad and component parts.
- 5. Church doors and automatic openers update: Mike Garcia and Larry Lage: Update on upgrade of church exterior doors and parish center middle doors: Larry Lage mentioned the progress that is being made on the doors. It is coming along well. 6 out of 8 church doors have broken hinges and need attention and repair. Automatic door openers will need to open both doors, as one door is too narrow for wheelchair access. Joe Demonaco will install new doors and frames in the parish center entrances.
- 6. Update church marquee Sign: Fr. Nick will contact Dan Heileman after Easter.
- 7. AED for church and parish center: Mike Garcia: Still trying to pin down dates for parish staff and parish leadership, including the Ushers and Knights of Columbus. The Catechists are trained. 8. Sunday offering collection receptacles: Mike Garcia. Still working on product development. How can we create something that meets the eye when you enter church, but is discreet and blends in?

- 9. Storage area for K of C, Christian Formation and FAM youth group: Storage Closet in Classroom 1. Rocky Mercier is working on it this week. He should finish the rough work this week, but will need to consult those who will be using it to order and install proper storage shelves and accessories. Classroom 1, where the closet is located, will be operable when Christian Formation classes resume during Holy Week.
 10. Any other Old Business? None.
- B. Issues for dialogue, sharing, reaction, proposing (New Business)
- 1. Current Updates on other parish stewardship efforts
- a. Catholic Services Appeal: 10% of overage to Ray of Hope Day Center: CSA 2016 was successful. We went over the parish target by almost \$1300! A check for the Ray of Hope Day Center, the coordinating office for the Macomb County Warming Center will be sent. Fr. Nick informed the Council that as of March 7, the CSA 2017 parish target is \$91,038 –a 16% increase over last year's target of \$78,444. He has sent an official letter of protest, asking that the parish target for 2017 be reduced by at least \$10,000. The CSA Target Appeals Committee is meeting this month, and will review the request.
- b. Changing Lives Together: \$150,000 was spent on the two new church bathrooms, leaving us a balance in that account of about \$53,000. We are hoping to build our storage area for between \$53,000 and \$80,000.
- c. Sunday Offering: We are moving from Parish Soft to Connect Now, and this will impact our on-line giving. So far, 35 families are giving their church support on-line. Our Sunday collections remain \$30,000 below budget.
- 2. Report from Parish Pastoral Council -- Setting new dates for the new master events parish calendar 2017-2018 and brainstorming to cut down on fund-raising events and conflicts: A spirit-filled and successful meeting took place at the end of March. Reps were present from the parish staff, PPC, Ushers, K of C and ACWC. It was agreed to meet quarterly. Lori will provide the dates of collections mandated by the Archdiocese so as not to cause conflict. We have 15 fund-raising events that take place over a twelve-month period! How can we combine some of these?

 3. Any other New Business?
- a. Propose SCRIPTS fundraising: A suggestion was made that we consider the SCRIPTS fundraising program, through which local businesses donate a portion of receipts to a non-profit.
- b. LED lights for the parish center hall, hallways and classrooms: While initially it will be expensive to buy the bulbs, after 5 to 7 years, they would pay for themselves.
- c. Garbage receptacles/ash trays for the church entrances: What was purchased and installed turned out to be of inferior quality. We receive a store credit and will try again.
- d. Needed repairs for water pipeline from parish center to Dearden St.: The pipes going from the parish center and under Dearden Street to the other side of the street needs major repair or replacement. It is 44 feet from the building to the sidewalk, another 15 feet to the street, and 40 feet across the street. Estimated costs are \$4,300 for the bare minimum, \$11,500 to back hoe, and \$16,900 to dig up the whole are and repair/replace. The nearby tree also needs to come down. All of this will be at our expense and is not covered by our property insurance.

Evaluation of the Meeting: Useful. Got a lot done.

ONGOING PARISH LIFE

a. Old Business

- 1. The parts for our new sound system have arrived at the sound company, but are not yet on site. We hope to have them installed soon.
- 2. The dates for our Festival of Ministries has been changed to September 16-17 to be combined with the 55th anniversary celebration of our parish. Several organizations and volunteers will be working to make this a parish-wide event.
- 3. The overall evaluation of our Lent and Easter liturgical celebrations was positive. The homilies were inspiring. Larger crowds were present. Some practical issues regarding preparing the incense earlier, consecrating more hosts, and reminding the people that if the consecrated hosts run short, Jesus is fully present in the wine which has become the Precious Blood. A question was asked if 6 ministers are needed for the foot washing and Fr. Nick explained that they were.
- 4. The brainstorming meeting that was held on March 28th with representatives from the various organizations was very good. The group discussed ways that the various organizations could work together for parish wide events and keep the fund-raising events to a limit and scheduled over a period of time (not several close together). The group decided that more meetings for planning are needed and that the first event would be our parish's 55th anniversary celebration on September 16-17. This will also be combined with our Festival of Ministries.
- 5. Other: (a) Based on our parish demographics, it is suggested that our evangelization focus be first on our Religious Education families and then on the household in our neighborhoods.
- (b) A suggestion was made that we periodically list in the parish bulletin the expenses the parish incurs for such things as heat, light, altar bread and wine, etc. so parishioners can better understand our financial responsibilities.

b. New Business

- 1. The Appalachia Mission trip will be combined with members from St. Michael's Parish in Sterling Heights and those from our parish. There are 20 people who have volunteered to be "missionaries," ten from each parish.
- 2. The Divine Mercy Novena is being recited on Monday through Friday at 6:30PM and is being led by Fr. Nick and Deacon Marion. There are about 35 people in attendance.

- 3. The new welcome books are being printed by the Archdiocese of Detroit print office and should be available in mid-May. There was a delay in the Pictorial Directory delivery, but they will be available soon. Notice will be given when they arrive to those entitled to receive one.
- 4. As part of our parish's 55th anniversary celebration on September 17th, we will invite our newly-appointed regional moderator, Bishop Bob Fisher, to be the main presider at the 11:00 Mass.
- 5. Archbishop Allen Vigneron will be issuing a pastoral letter which he will compose after praying over and reading over all the consensus statements that were composed at Synod 16. That letter will give parishes the direction they are to go in following Synod 16.
- 6. Other: (a) There is a need for more opportunities for Bible Study classes and adult faith formation in our parish offered at different times to accommodate people's schedule. Some planning is already being done on this. Depending on who becomes the new director for the RCIA, some of that planning may become part of his/her responsibility.
- (b) Our parish organ is 50 years old. John McGovern' organ recital is on April 30th at 4:00PM.

- 2. Update on parish on-line giving for Sunday collection church support: We are moving from Parish Soft to Connect Now, and this will impact our on-line giving. So far, 35 families are giving their church support on-line.
- 3. Amazing Parish follow-up: Hard to believe that a full year has gone by since the Amazing Parish workshop, attended by five people from our parish. After Easter, we will revisit this.
