"The Equality Act and Christians"

"There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." Galatians 3:28

The Bible recognizes the value of equality as a social good. Galatians 3:28 recognizes a certain equality that all of us Christians have before God. The Bible also recognizes that every human being bears the image of God and has inherent value and worth. As Christians, we can appreciate the role of government in promoting equality. However, the latest attempt by Congress to promote equality is leading to inequality and discrimination against Christians, and harm to children and families.

On May 17 the House of Representatives passed "The Equality Act," 236-173, with every Democrat voting in favor of it along with eight Republicans. It is unlikely to pass the Senate, but a change in the composition of the Senate could lead to a different result. The proposed law would extend civil rights protections to LGBT people by prohibiting discrimination based on sexual orientation or gender identity.

The Heritage Foundation identifies five groups who would become unequal before the law if this proposed legislation were to pass. First, employers and workers would have to conform to the new sexual norms, or they would lose their businesses and jobs. Cake bakers and florists and photographers could not refuse to be involved with gay weddings because of their Christian convictions. Teachers would be required to use the preferred pronouns of transgender students.

Second, doctors, nurses, hospitals, and insurance companies would be required to provide gender changing procedures, even against their better judgments, and against their religious convictions.

Third, parents and children would be harmed by the possibility of government overriding parental responsibility in siding with children who have gender identity issues. Studies show that 80 to 95% of children with gender dysphoria (distress caused by the perception that one's birth gender does not match one's perceived gender identity) problems no longer feel distressed by their bodies after reaching puberty.

Fourth, women would be endangered by allowing biological males into female locker rooms and bathrooms. In Connecticut, biological males have been allowed to compete in women's track events and have won state titles because they have a physical advantage over biological females.

Fifth, faith based charities have

already been discriminated against because they acknowledge the value of having a mother and a father, and they recognize the reality of biological sex differences. Christian adoption and foster care agencies have been shut down in several states. In Massachusetts churches have gone to court to prevent state government from mandating that they must allow transgender people to use the bathroom of their chosen identity.

The Religious Freedom Restoration was passed with overwhelming support in Congress in 1993. It guarantees religious rights against government intrusions. This proposed legislation targets the overthrow of this law. Section 1107 says, "The Religious Freedom Restoration Act of 1993 shall not provide a claim concerning, or a defense to a claim under, a covered title, or provide a basis for challenging the application or enforcement of a covered title." Christians, be aware of what our legislators are doing.




