Seek ye the Lord, with heart, mind, and soul

Words from the Pastor

Dear friends:

This is the time when members in most churches are asked to support the church with a pledge of financial support for the next year. We call this "stewardship." which is our responsibility to manage the resources of the world that God has given us for God's will and purpose. Usually, we focus on the monetary aspect of this responsibility. What will you give out of your financial resources for the work of the church next year?

I would also like to expand my focus to include time and talents. This is not a new idea, but let's consider it again. What do we mean by time and talents? Why do we link this to stewardship? God has not only given us money to manage. God has also given us our lives. By this we mean our abilities, talents, and relationships with each other. These are not "things," like money and property, but gifts from God that make life worth living. How do we "spend" our talents and abilities? How much time do we spend together developing our relationships? These are the most important questions of life. How do we use our talents to serve each other?

Oddly enough, the English word "talent" comes from a Greek word meaning a unit of money. (Check it out in a dictionary!) The connection is the use of the Greek word talent (meaning money) in Matthew 25: 14-30. In this passage, Jesus told a parable about a master who was going away for a long journey. He gave his servants some money (talents) and when he returned he praised the servants who had invested the money to make more money, but condemned the servant who could only give back what was originally given to him. By telling this parable, Jesus was obviously encouraging us to invest money so that it would grow and

expand. Over the centuries, Christians have interpreted this parable to refer not only to money, but also to the development and expansion of human abilities. Thus, the Greek word for money, talent, evolved into the English word "talent" which means a person's natural abilities.

Needless to say, God is calling upon us to expand our "talents," whether they be financial resources or human abilities, to serve God in the world. How do we manage our natural abilities? Do we use then in service to others and God? How do we spend our time? Do we use our time to develop relationships of love with each other and God? How much time do we spend with our families? How much time do we spend in prayer? If we use our time and talents wisely, we will expand our service to God. As you consider your financial support to our congregation, also consider the use of your time and talents. Surely you have the talent to do something in the church, in the community, or with your family that serves God and gives God glory. Are you willing to be a good steward of your God-given time and talents for service to God?

"Giving Thanks With a Joyful Heart"

Giving thanks is remembering God is the source of all good things.

The ability to give thanks with a joyful heart begins with recognizing God as the source of all good things and that God is always faithful toward his children. Remembering what God done, made possible, or mercifully prevented doesn't just provide us with a sense of self-satisfied gratitude. We are to remember God is the one who is faithful and provides, not us. Giving thanks is an important corrective to our own egos. Giving thanks helps us remember who is in charge (hint: not us!). Giving thanks helps us remember God is the landowner and we are only stewards.

Human nature hasn't changed much since the days of ancient Israel. Human beings still feel the need to pat ourselves on the back when things go well, but blame God when they go wrong. The Bible warns us never to forget that God and God alone is the source of all that we have, all that we are, and all that is to come. Because of this, it is our spiritual duty to share God's gifts and our blessings with others.

We've all heard said, "God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor. 9:7). But we rarely quote all of what Paul originally wrote to the Corinthian church, "Each one of you must make up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." We too are compelled to make up our minds to offer what we have with joyful heart. If we thank God out of bitterness or conceit we are not thanking God. We thank God out of the sheer joy of having received abundantly.

Our God is an abundant God offering abundant life to all. Remember how Jesus said, "I have come that you might have abundant life" (John 10:10). We need only open our eyes, our hearts to hear his invitation to receive that abundant life. When we have accepted God's gracious offer of life everlasting, we know the joy that comes from deep within and bubbles up as thanksgiving. Give thanks then with a joyful heart now and always.

All Saints' Day—Nov. 1st

In early Christian tradition, saints' days began as a way to mark the anniversary of a martyr's death — his or her "birthday" as a saint. All Saints' Day has a rather different focus in the Reformed tradition. While we may give thanks for the lives of particular luminaries of ages past, the emphasis is on the ongoing sanctification of the whole people of God. Rather than putting saints on pedestals as holy people set apart in glory, we give glory to God for the ordinary, holy lives of the believers in this and every age. This is an appropriate time to give thanks to members of the community of faith who have died in the past year. We also pray that we may be counted among the company of the faithful in God's eternal realm.

All Saints' Day has been celebrated on November 1 since the year 835. It is a time to rejoice in all who through the ages have faithfully served the Lord. The day reminds us that we are part of one continuing, living communion of saints. It is a time to claim our kinship with the "glorious company of apostles ... the noble fellowship of prophets ... the whiterobed army of martyrs" (Te Deum). It is a time to express our gratitude for all who in ages of darkness kept the faith, for those who have take the gospel to the ends of the earth, for prophetic voices who have called the church to be faithful in life and service, for all who have witnessed to God's justice and peace in every nation. In the knowledge that others have persevered, we are encouraged to endure against all odds (Hebrews 12:1-2). Reminded that God was with the faithful of the past, we are reassured that God is with us today, moving us and all creation toward God's end in time. In this context, it is appropriate for a congregation on All Saints' Day to commemorate the lives of those who died during the previous year.
