



The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings w/your children

Here at our parish, we are transitioning away from Children's Liturgy of the Word during the Mass, and instead, we would like to encourage parents to discuss the weekly readings or homily with their children either before or after Mass occurs. This spiritual conversation, even if it is simple or a bit scattered, can be very powerful, and it is a way for God's word to come alive in our hearts. We will provide questions and discussion points to help parents start this conversation with their children, and please consider doing this with your family each week!

When you enter church for Mass, do you dip your hand in holy water and make the Sign of the Cross? Why do you do this?

Water is so important. In what ways is water needed in our everyday lives? More than half of our bodies are water and we need to drink water to stay alive. You can go weeks without food but we can't go more than a few days without water.

In the first reading, the Israelites who followed Moses into the desert knew how important water was to them. Moses led the people out of slavery in Egypt into a place of freedom, but that place was a desert. When the people realized they didn't have water, they wondered what good freedom was without life. What did God tell Moses to do so the people would have water? Although the people followed Moses, it was truly God who led them. God made a promise to take care of them. God provided what the people needed to get them to a new life of freedom.

In the Gospel. Jesus was traveling about noon time, when it was very hot. People then didn't have faucets in their homes for water. They had to go to a community well to get their water and bring it home. A woman was at the well to get water to cool her. Jesus told her he had the living water. She must have thought they were cool refreshing waters. What do you think Jesus meant by having living water?

During the season of Lent we are getting ready to celebrate the new life that Jesus offered to us through his suffering, death and resurrection. There are some people in our parish who are preparing to receive the water of Baptism in a few weeks.



Living our Faith: Pray for those people who are preparing to come into our church at the Easter Vigil. Pray for yourself that you can recognize the truth of Christ's living waters in your life.
