Ps. 133: "Behold how good and how pleasant it is for brethern to dwell together in unity!!! It is like the precious ointment upon the head, that ran down upon the beard, even Aaron's beard: that went down to the skirts of his garments; As the dew of Hermon, and as the dew that descended upon the mountains of Zion: for there the Lord commanded the blessing, even life for evermore." What does the beard mean? It speaks of a full grown man, a man of maturity. It does not indicate the feminine nature, or the immaturity of a child. The High Priest was not able to take office until he was 30. (Num. 4) This is not the anointing of the Spirit given to children nor the woman, the bride. This is an anointing given to the masculine, mature Manchild to govern and rule. It is for authority, for the Throne.

Joseph was 30 (Gen. 41:14, 46) when he shaved his beard and sat down on Pharoah's throne. Jesus was 30 years old (Luke 3:23) when he received the authority of God in the fulness of the Spirit that came upon him at Jordan. David received a childhood anointing by Samuel for Kingship, however, he was 30 years old (II Sam. 8:4) when he was anointed king over all Israel with the anointing that ran down upon his beard. Thirty is symbolic of full stature, full maturity.

Yes, the Body of Christ has already received an anointing, the earnest of our inheritance (Eph. 1:14). With it we are able even in our immaturity to do exploits in His Name. But another anointing is coming. And it is coming upon the fully matured, those who have come to "the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ" (Eph. 4:13) This anointing is for government. No more just killing bears and lions and giants.

Look at Jesus, after His baptism at Jordan, Divine authority was manifested in His life. The winds obey Him, the fig tree withers at His command. Devils flee at His word. Sickness and death bow in submission, for here is God's divine Government in the earth. The first one to truly have "oil on the beard". All others were shadows, types or symbols. He is the reality and He is the first born of many brothers (Rom. 8:29). Jesus was the first born of God's mature masculine company of rulers who make up His glorious Body. ## Dear Friends,



Dear Brother Tabor:

It has been my privilege to be at the Bible School for a few days, and I am writing you, or any one who may be interested, a few of my thoughts concerning the school, it's purposes and accomplishments. I was greatly impressed when I found you and your wife taking courses in music However, when I heard of your meeting last summer from which the workers were called away, and there was no one to every pray or sing an altar call, I could easily visualize your position, and understood why a school of music would be necessary for some in our movement.

I will have to confess, Brother Tabor, that I had some preconceived ideas before coming to Baxter, and one of them I wish to express in this writing. I had an opinion that the school would be a benefit only to the young beginners, preachers and workers. But after attending many of the classes, my opinion is different, and I am convinced that any one, provided they were interested, could be benefitted by

the school. As you know, I am engaged in the production of rice at Katy, Texas. Each year the seed is planted, from it there always comes a crop of rice. A bountiful crop and an abundant harvest is the sincere desire of any good farmer. Wonderful crops have been produced during the last few years, mainly because of the efficient machinery that was available. In modern times nothing is more discouraging and fateful in the culture of rice than a lot of poorly made implements. Crops must go in and come out on time. The drills for sowing the seed rice should be equipped with sharp disc blades for the continuous planting of the seed uniformly shallow, medium, or deep, as the desire of the operator may be. Farmers are sticklers for good dependable tools because they produce results even when the elements are unfavorable. As in the planting season the same is true at harvest time. The combines are worked over, repaired, rebuilt, tuned up to a high point of efficiency for the purpose of gathering the golden grain the moment it is ripe. Getting ready proves to be the biggest job in the rice business. With good tools and implements the sowing and harvesting of rice becomes a pleasant experience.

In the Bible we read that our Saviour asks that His word be sown, and that someone should be interested in His harvest. What kind of implements would He enjoy using? What kind are we furnishing? If the instruments and tools are untried and weak, why not strengthen them? If worn, rusty and dull, why not sharpen and repair them for Him? Truly the Saviour should have the best available. We all agree that the greatest preacher of the gentile age was an educated and cultured gentleman. His sermons still live and are a consolation and joy to all. As an instrument in the Saviour's hands he proved a most profitable servant in sowing and harvesting for Him. His words have stood through the years.

I know, Brother Tabor, that you and your co-workers are helping our people with the School and I want to compliment you on the management. The house is kept clean from cellar to garret. Wholesome meals are served regularly and I noticed that without begging or soliciting, supplies came rolling in from seemingly unseen sources, beef, pork, canned goods, cases of eggs, canned fruits, vegetables and even home-made pies. Surely God has some faithful servants

somewhere who sense the need of a school and are supplying the where with to make it a success. Surely not all have quit or backslid. Surely some know the need for the Master's work today, and wish to have a part and fill a place in His great plan.

The Apostolic Faith Movement was cradled and nourished in a Bible School. I heard years ago how God wonderfully blessed in the school of 1900. Years later I also received some of the benefits in my own life. And now His word has been verified again in this school of 1946. He has anointed in the teaching and reading of the Bible. His presence and divine approval has been felt in the classroom where prophecy, doctrine, evangelism, English, speech and music have been taught and in addition some were sanctified, filled with the Holy Spirit, healed as shouts of joy to His praise filled the air. What more can we hope for or desire? I can only say, brother, let the good work continue until the Saviour comes and says, "Tis enough." May our people continue their support of this great institution, the Apostolic Faith Bible School.



## CONSIDER THE LILIES - CONSIDER YOUR WAYS

"Consider the lilies how they grow: they toil not, they spin not; and yet I say unto you, that Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these." Luke 12:27.

Let us consider the lily. The lily, one of God's most beautiful creations, comes forth with more splendor than even Solomon. Yet the lily bulb is planted three times its height below the surface of the ground. Too often so many of us want the beautiful appearance of the lily but we never come out of the mud of this world into a new life. Haggai 1:7 tells us, "Thus saith the Lord of hosts; Consider your ways." Prior to this rebuke, the children of Israel, who had been in captivity in Babylon, had been given permission to return to their homeland and rebuild the temple. However, for fourteen years they stopped work on the temple, becoming idle in God's work, and began building their own houses and possessions. They were putting more emphasis on their own desires than on the will of God. Yet the people still expected God to bless them and protect them—they were in the mud but wanted to be as the lily. What are we doing to build our spiritual temples? Are we striving for the splendor of the lily or are we choking ourselves on the cares and desires of this life?

One way in which we are often choked is the love of money. Although we need money to live, we need Christ to have life. Too often we get caught up in our jobs, our possessions, and our routines as the children of Israel did. I Timothy 6:10 says, "For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows." We need to take care that these temporal desires do not outweigh and take the place of our spiritual desires.

Another way in which we choke ourselves is in using, or mis-using the abilities and talents which the Lord has given to us. In the parable of the pounds in Luke 19:11-28 Jesus tells us of ten men who were given ten pounds. One man increased his pound to ten pounds, another increased his pound to five pounds; but another man kept his one pound laid up in a napkin. The two that increased their pounds were given authority over cities but the one who did not increase his pound had it taken away and given to the one with ten pounds. In this parable the Lord told his servants to "Occupy till I come". We also are to occupy till our Lord comes. Occupying means more than just staying busy. It means to see an increase or growth in our Christian lives if we are to receive God's blessings. If we fail to do what God would have us to do, we will not be used, but if we are faithful, He will entrust us with more work in His kingdom.

Finally, Paul exhorts us in Ephesians 4:1 to "Walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called." Each one of us has a job to do and we can come forth in perfection just as the lily if we will consider our ways and be careful not to let this world rob us of God's blessings and victories.

Philippians 2:5-8 says, "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross." Then in Luke 22:42, Christ "Saying, Father, if thou be willing, remove this cup from me: nevertheless not my will, but thing, be done." Just think if Christ would have said "I can't" when the Father ask Him to give His life for all mankind. Would we be where we are today if Christ had not been willing to die for us? If we are truly Christ-like, we will do the Father's will regardless of what we want to do. Christ preferred the cup to pass from Him, but He did what the Father wanted Him to do. So must we today be willing to put aside our wills and do the Father's will.

Before a person can truly do the will of the Father, he must be willing at heart to do so. God doesn't want a people that He has to beg for them to do His will. God will not beg you to do anything. He only stands at the door knocking. He wants willing workers that are happy to do His will. If we will not do the work God has for us, He will find someone else to do the work for Him; but until we face up to God's will in our lives, we will never enjoy life and experience the fulness of living for the Lord.

When God gives a person a job to do, He always supplies the ability to fulfill that job also. Sometimes we as Christians feel that the job God has given us is for someone that is more capable than we are. God would not have ask you to do that job unless He Knew that you were capable to handle the job. A lot of times we may be incapable of doing a job but that is where the power of the Lord helps us. I once heard an interesting quote that said, "God doesn't ask for ability; He only asks for availability." If you are available to do the job, God will supply the ability to complete the job. In Exodus 3:10-12, we find that Moses faced this very problem. It says, "Come now therefore, and I will send thee unto Pharaoh, that thou mayest bring forth my people the children of Israel out of Egypt. And Moses said unto God, Who am I, that I

should go unto Pharaoh, and that I should bring forth the children of Israel out of Egypt? And he said, Certainly I will be with thee; and this shall be a token unto thee: When thou hast brought forth the people out of Egypt, ye shall serve God upon this mountain." Moses felt incapable of the task God wanted him to do, but God assured him that He would be with him and that he could do the job. The same applies for us today. God works today just as He did back in the time of Moses.

There are many jobs that the Lord would have us to do in the church: there must be willing teachers to teach classes; there must be willing singers to sing in the services; there must be willing janitors to help keep the church clean; there must be willing helpers to help in all the different activities of the church; and there are so many more different jobs that each of us can do if only we are willing to do them. If we all work together and each member does everything runs much smoother. There are also many jobs that the Lord would have us to do in our own individual lives at home. Whatever job God has for you, He also has the ability for you to do that job. Don't be afraid to step out by faith. The Word tells us we live by faith, so let us put that faith to action. The next time we are asked to do a job in the church or any place where the Lord's work can and needs done, let us step out and meet the challenge by putting our faith in God. We can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth us. He will always see us through.

We are called Range Missionary Ladies and it is called a Community group. We meet every two weeks with the exception of the summer months. We meet all day and have a covered dish dinner. We have a devotional each time and special prayer. We tack quilts and get some of them hemmed. We also cut quilt blocks, and mend clothes and tear up old clothes for making quilts and insides for quilts. Our money for projects come from donations among our group and other interested people.

Here is a report of our work for the year of 1980:

We took lap robes, bibs, pajamas, robes and fruit to rest homes in Perryton, Texas and Guymon, Oklahoma.

To Cal Farley's Boys' Ranch we gave 128 quilts, 50 throw pillows and 4 big frog pillows. We made a special trip to take them. It was a special time for all of us. They have more than 375 boys.

To Girl's Town in Borger, Texas we gave 29 boxes of clothing, 22 quilts, pillow and bedspreads. We also took art and craft supplies, cookies, chips, crackers and popcorn.

We sent three Christmas boxes to Don Russell Orphan's Home. These contained candy, gum, puzzles, coloring books, storybooks, Crayolas and stuffed animals.

We gave clothing, 44 large quilts, 12 baby quilts, food and Christmas things to Missionary Naomi Saulter of Sells, Arizona. She works on Papaga and Navijo Indian Reservations.

We gave clothing to Salvation Army and to a mission in Guymon, Okla.

We also fixed 38 Thanksgiving plates and delivered to the elderly.

The total amount for the year of 1980 was:

Ninety-nine boxes of clothes, 194 packages of gum, 12 baby quilts, 22 lap robes, eight bibs, 37 packages of candy, 190 packages of gum and we made 23 stuffed kittens and frogs for Christmas boxes.

This is our 28th year. It started small but has grown. God has blessed our efforts and we are thankful for it. What a privilege to work for the Lord in a small way. We do give quilts to people who have fires in their homes or wherever there is a need.

I went the ways of the world and didn't think I had any faith in anything anymore.

In the summer of 1979, I became pregnant again. The doctors here in Snyder advised an abortion. I couldn't face that so I went to a doctor in Big Springs. I feel like the Lord just led me to him. He started working with me. At four months he found my problem. I had a problem correctable by a minor surgery. He performed it on this pregnancy too late to save the baby. We lost a little boy at 5½ months. But. in the meantime, the Lord had been working with me. I had found my way back to Him. He had bathed me in His love daily and I couldn't become depressed over my loss like I had always done before. He started enlightening me with His promises and He showed me the thief was the one that came to steal, kill and destroy, not He. I discovered promises like "Delight thyself in the Lord and He will give thee the desires of they heart." Psalm 37:4. After I got it in my spirit it was the Lord's will for me to have a child, I was ready to go. When I was about a month and a half along with Angela 1 was in a meeting in Rockdale. The Lord sent a man I had never seen before to pray with me about the baby. He told me after the service that in Hebrews chapter 1 it says that "God is upholding all things by the power of His word." If God can uphold the universe by the power of His word, He can uphold one small child for nine months in the womb. His word is alive and you can depend on it entirely. I stood on that scripture and the promise that none shall cast forth their fruits before season. The doctor told his nurses in the delivery room that I wasn't acting like someone with a problem. Praise the Lord I didn't have one. The baby developed yellow jaundice after birth and her bilirubin count went way high. They couldn't get it down and finally told us there was a problem. He started testing for spinal meningitis. Her spinal tap showed a definite infection somewhere and he started cultures to see if they would grow indicating mengingitis. I went over to my husband and took his hand and we stood on Matthew 18:19, the agreement scripture, and agreed nothing would grow on the culture. I called my Church that was in service right then and the pastor told me later they stood on the same scripture. The baby took a turn for the better immediately. I knew she was healed. The doctor told us she started improving about that time that same day. She's a healthy, beautiful baby and we praise God for her. Oh, yes, the doctor never found where her infection was but that she had had one somewhere. She's truly our little miracle.

God is never in a hurry but spends years with those He expects to greatly use. He never thinks the days of preparation too long or too dull.

## **Doctrinal Teachings**

## TRI-UNITY OF THE GODHEAD

We believe in the Tri-unity of the Godhead, consisting of God the Father, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Ghost. These three are all eternally existant, separate personalities, working together as One. "For there are three that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost: and these three are one." IJohn 5:7. We believe God is the Supreme Diety, Sovereign of the Universe, creative and administrative; Holy in nature, attributes and purpose.

We believe Jesus Christ is the second person in the Tri-unity of the Godhead; that He was with God the Father in the beginning and has always been one of the eternal Godhead (John 1:1); that He became incarnate by the Holy Ghost (Luke 1:35) and was born of the virgin Mary. We believe that Jesus died for our sins, and that He arose from the dead and ascended into heaven where He is now our Interessor.

We believe the Holy Ghost is the third person in the Tri-unity of the Godhead; that He is ever present and efficiently active in and with the Church of Christ, convincing the world of sin.

## THE BIBLE

We believe in the inspiration of the Holy Scriptures by which we understand that the 66 books of the Old and New Testaments, given by divine inspiration, reveal the will of God in all things necessary to our salvation; so that whatever is not contained therein is not enjoined as an article of Faith.

## SIN

We believe that sin is the corruption of the nature of all the offspring of Adam, and that "All have sinned and come short of the glory of God," Romans 3:23. Jesus said, "..except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish," Luke 13:3. But through the shedding of His blood on the cross, Jesus made full atonement for any or all of the human race who will forsake sin and serve a risen Savior, John 3:16.

## THE GRACE OF GOD

Grace is the unmerited favor of God brought to man through the supreme sacrifice made by Jesus on the cross, John 1:17.

## **ENLIGHTENMENT**

Enlightenment is the act of being enlightened or instructed by the Holy Ghost that we may see or desire the things of God, Psalm 19:8; Ephesians 1:18.

## REPENTANCE [act of man]

Repentance is a Godly sorrow for sin; a broken and a contrite heart, Psalm 51:7, 10, 17. It is a thorough change of mind and heart, Luke 3:8; Romans 10:10.

## CONVERSION OR JUSTIFICATION [act of God].

The first work of Grace. This is to be changed from a sinful state to the place of being justified before God and the blood of Christ cleanses us from all our sins, Romans 5:1; 6:23; I John 1:17. This is a regeneration—the beginning of a new life, Titus 3:5; John 1:12.

## CONSECRATION [act of man]

Consecration is the dedicating of a person, place or thing and in God's plan of our salvation, it includes the dedicating of self, our possessions and hopes to the will of God, Romans 12:1, 2; Hebrews 10:20.

## SANCTIFICATION-THE NEW BIRTH [act of God]

This is the second definite work of Grace. God accepts our consecration and sets us free from the carnal nature, or that nature to want to do the things of sin. This is the NEW BIRTH and the inner man is cleansed, John 3:3; James 1:18. This does not make it impossible to sin but it takes away the desire to sin. We are set apart to be His workmen and to give a life of service unto God. We are sanctified, body, soul, spirit, I Thessalonians 5:23; 4:3, 4.

## ANOINTING OF THE HOLY GHOST

Sometimes this is called the Anointing that Abideth. It is a unction or understanding, taught and led by the Holy Ghost, II Peter 1:21; I John 2:20, 21; 2:27.

## **BAPTISM OF THE HOLY GHOST**

This is a gift of power upon a sanctified life with the evidence of speaking in other languages as the Spirit gives utterance. This experience is given for the edifying of the individual and also to edify the church through the interpretation. It is also a sign to unbelievers. Acts 2:4. John 14:16; Joel 2:28-29; Acts 2:16-18, 41; Acts 1:8.

## **DIVINE HEALING**

We believe that Jesus suffered the stripes upon His body, at His trial, for the healing of our bodies as well as for the healing of our souls. James 5:14-16; I Peter 2:24; Isaiah 53:5; III John 2.

## NO DIVORCE AND REMARRIAGE

We believe when a man takes a wife they become one flesh in the sight of God. Genesis 2:24; Ephesians 5:31. Jesus said, "They are no twain, but one flesh. What therefore God hath joined together, let no man put asunder." Matthew 19:6. To divorce and remarry is committing adultery, Matthew 19:9; Luke 16:18; I Corinthians 7:39. Anyone who is divorced and remarried cannot serve in any official capacity in the Church or Sunday School. Titus 1:16; I Timothy 3:2.

## TITHES AND OFFERINGS

We believe that we should pay one tenth of all our increase to God and that it should be used for the spreading of the Gospel, and that we have given nothing until we have given an offering above the tithe. Offerings may be used for the building and up-keep of Churches and Church properties. Malachi 3:8, 10; Luke 11:42.

## REDEMPTION OF THE SAINTS

We believe that at the close of this dispensation, Jesus will appear in the clouds to catch away His Elect, Matthew 24:29-31; Revelation 1:7 and 12:5) and that this Elect number shall be 144,000 who are pure before God. Revelation 14:1-5.

## SECOND COMING OF CHRIST

We believe that Jesus shall come to this earth again and that after He has destroyed the wicked at the battle of Armageddon, He will set up His Kingdom and shall reign for 1,000 years upon this earth. Daniel 7:13-14; John 14:3; Acts 1:11.

## THOUSAND YEAR REIGN OF CHRIST

We believe that when Jesus returns to this earth to rule in His Kingdom that He will bring that 144,000 redeemed with Him and that the blessed and Holy dead will be resurrected—this is the first resurrection—and that they along with the living sanctified will meet Him and become Kings and Priests in His Kingdom. I Thessalonians 4:14-18; Revelation 1:6.

## FIRST AND SECOND RESURRECTIONS

We believe in two resurrections. The first resurrection will be at the time Jesus comes back to reign for 1,000 years upon this earth and the second will be at the end of that reign of 1,000 years, Revelation 20:4-6.

## CONDITIONAL IMMORALITY OR LIFE THROUGH CHRIST

We believe eternal life will be given only to those who accept Jesus as their personal Savior and are living for Him at the end of this life, Matthew 24:13. When Jesus shall come back to this earth, those wo are alive and remain shall be changed from a mortal body to an immortal body—this applies also to the 144,000 Redeemed at the time of their redemption—and the dead in Christ shall receive an incorruptable body at the time of their resurrection. Immortality applies only to the changed body—not to the soul. I Timothy 6:15, 16; I John 5:11-12; Romans 2:7; I Corinthians 15:50-54.

## **CREATION AND FORMATION**

We believe that 1,000 years of time, as we count time. equals one day of God's time, II Peter 3:8, and that in the sixth day of His creation week, He created—spoke into existance—both man and woman, Genesis 1:26-28. God rested the seventh day then on the first day of His second week-our present week-He formed Adam from the dust of the ground, Genesis 2:6-7. Later God took one of Adam's ribs and made Eve to be Adam's help meet, Genesis 2:21-24. We believe these two races of people dwelt upon the earth until the flood in the days of Noah but because of the wickedness of man, God sent the flood and all the offspring of intermarriages between the two races were destroyed and the created race were placed in a prison. After Jesus' crucifixion and before His resurrection, He went to preach to those people that they too might be judged by the same judgement as the formed race. Matthew 12:40; I Peter 3:19-20; II Peter 2:4-5; I Peter 4:6.

## DESTRUCTION OF THE WICKED

We believe there is only one way to eternal life and that is by justification through the Blood of Christ and that from the time of that experience we must continue to serve Him. All those people who turn back or do not even start to serve the Lord, do not have eternal life and will be destroyed in the lake of fire after the Judgment Day. Ezekiel 18:4, 21, 24; Matthew 7:13; II Thessalonians 1:7-9; Romans 6:23; Malachi 4:1; This is the second death.

## **ORDINANCES**

Water baptism by immersion:

We believe that water baptism is an outward sign of the inward work which has already been done and that to fulfill all righteousness we need to follow Jesus in baptism. It signifies or is a symbol of Jesus' death, burial and resurrection. Matthew 3:13-15; Matthew 28:19; Romans 6:3-4.

Communion: (often called the Lord's supper)

When we partake of the bread and the fruit of the vine (grape juice) we are taking them as a symbol of the broken body and the shed blood of Jesus and it is a service in remembrance of His death on the cross. Matthew 26:26-28; I Corinthians 11:23-30.

Feet Washing: When Jesus came to this earth, He took upon Him the form of a servant Philippians 2:3-8, and in keeping with His humbleness and willingness to serve, He washed the disciples feet, John 13:5, 14. Since Jesus gave that example we believe that in observing that ordinance we are showing humbleness and willingness to serve our fellowmen.
