


Our Annual Easter Egg Hunt will take place on Sunday, April 16th after the 11am Mass.

Welcome to a new church season – Easter Season. The Alleluia and the Gloria are back in the Mass because we are rejoicing! Father will be wearing white vestments during the Easter Season.



Alleluia! We have reached Easter Sunday. This is the most important day of our church when we celebrate that Jesus is risen!




Today we know that Jesus overcame death for all of us. By Jesus' resurrection, we have hope in living forever with our God in heaven after our life on earth is complete.
