


## Shippensburg Community Resource Coalition

#### **Our Purpose and Objectives**

- To increase access to social services and counseling services.
- To increase access to youth programming.
- To partner with existing stakeholders such as the school district and Shippensburg University to meet educational and community needs.

The SCRC was started in 2010 in response to the growing need to help residents find and utilize social services. Shippensburg falls between the counties of Franklin and Cumberland which means that services can be difficult for community members to access if the services extend to Shippensburg at all. The Resource Coalition has brought service providers and community members together since this time, with the aim of connecting clients with resources as well as developing programs to meet needs.

The SCRC is a Shippensburg University Center For Excellence and serves as a "learning lab" for the university. Students, Faculty, and staff are involved in our work and have initiated many of our programs and services. We also provide a bridge for building community-university relationships. ## The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings w/your children

Here at our parish, we are transitioning away

from Children's Liturgy of the Word during the Mass, and instead, we would like to encourage parents to discuss the weekly readings or homily with their children either before or after Mass occurs. This spiritual conversation, even if it is simple or a bit scattered, can be very powerful, and it is a way for God's word to come alive in our hearts. We will provide questions and discussion points to help parents start this conversation with their children, and please consider doing this with your family each week!

We sometimes give gifts to show others how important they are to us and to show that we love them. God has given us so many gifts. All of creation is a gift to us. The people in our lives, who have been made by God, are gifts to us.

What are some other gifts God has given you? How do you treat the gifts God ahs given you?

God has given us instructions on how to receive these gifts in a loving way. Our choices to do or not do things can make our relationship with God real but they can also harm that relationship with him and with others. God has helped us by giving us commandment to live a life of love. Jesus told us the greatest commandment has two parts: love God first and love your neighbor. When Jesus reminded his disciples of the commandments he also invited them to see that we can go beyond protecting relationships from being broken beyond repair. Jesus tells us that we can do more that not kill. We could keep our anger in control so that we don't hurt others. He told us we can do more than just not break an oath. We can always speak the truth and say what is right. We don't just keep the gift's God has given us from being destroyed. We act in ways that show we treasure all the gifts God ahs given us because we treasure God and know God treasures us.








This weekend we take up our collection to support the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa. The people of Africa are joyous and faith-filled—but as the Church
