Mayor Mike Vandersteen and his group of 34 travelers recognized the 50th anniversary of the Sister City relationship between Sheboygan and Esslingen, Germany by planting a Sugar Maple Tree (Wisconsin's state tree) in Merkel Park in Esslingen on May 17th.



The representatives from Sheboygan were treated like visiting royalty, with a welcome luncheon, a trip to Rothenburg, and an elegant reception and dinner to mark the anniversary.
