Tidings from Timothy

When you try to make the world a better place by making more Christians, then that means interacting with people. Did you know that Jesus gave us a guidline for the kinds of people in this world that you run into? He most definitely did. This morning we will be examining the kinds of "soil" as He put it, that we will find when trying to spread the word.

How Righteous are the "righteous"?

People wonder why good people suffer. One individual who asked why God would

punish the "good" with the "wicked" was Habakkuk the prophet. Because Habakkuk prophesied to the people of Judah just before the Babylonian captivity took place, he recognized the wickedness of the Babylonians and could not understand why God would allow a wicked nation such as Babylon to punish a "righteous" nation like Judah. Thus, he questioned God, "Why do You look on those who deal treacherously, and hold Your tongue when the wicked devours a person more righteous than he?" (Habakkuk 1:13).

God answered Habakkuk in a very revealing way. In fact, He provided Habakkuk with five reasons as to why Judah was being punished.

First, the people of Judah had been increasing what was not theirs (Habakkuk 2:6). Second, they had been coveting evil gain for their houses (Habakkuk 2:9).

Third, they were building towns with bloodshed (Habakkuk 2:12).

Fourth, they were engaging in the distribution and consumption of alcoholic beverages (Habakkuk 2:15).

Finally, they were worshipping idols (Habakkuk 2:19).

In reality, God's answer showed that people were not nearly so righteous as they thought.

In our nation, many people have asked the same question as Habakkuk. They have wondered aloud why God would allow those who are wicked to harm our "Christian" nation. The answer to this question is not much different than Habakkuk's. Many in our nation are guilty of the same basic sins that God charged Judah with. We steal, covet, murder, drink alcohol, and worship everything but the true God, and as long as these practices continue, we, like the people of Judah, are far from righteous.

The only answer to this ungodly behavior is true repentance. Instead of being self-righteous, let us turn to God and beg for mercy. Remember, "Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people" (Proverbs 14:34). May God bless us as we serve Him!
