Column 1: Last name or surname of individual

Column 2: First and middle name of individual

Column 3: LB Order#: List of Men Ordered to Report to the Local Board for Military Service
The number in this column is the Order No. listed in this report. For each individual listed on this report the following information is available: Order No., Serial No., Name, Race, and Induction Date. This list is in order by date of induction and was created by the Local Board for Lavaca County.

Column 4: Plaque: Plaque with names of military veterans located on first floor of Lavaca County Courthouse.

Column 5: Tise: A six volume set of cemetery listings from *Lavaca County Texas Cemetery Records* by Sammy Tise. The annotation in the column is the volume and page number of the burial information. This column also will provide information about the burial location of the service man who died while in service buried in or outside of Lavaca County. When the name of the cemetery is in this column, the individual's grave was not listed in any of the Tise books; either the grave was marked or the individual died after the cemetery books were published.

Column 6: Memorial: Names on Granite Memorial Monument erected November 11, 1986 by VFW Post #6382 and American Legion Post #230 on the grounds of the Lavaca County Courthouse.

Column 7: Discharge: Discharge Record for Soldiers and Sailors Volumes 1 – 6. The index and actual records are available at the Lavaca County Clerk's Office in Hallettsville, Texas. Volumes 1 and 2 are available online at Family Search.

Column 8: SWNE: The July 4, 1919 issue of the Semi-Weekly New Era newspaper published in Hallettsville, Texas. This issue was printed to celebrate the end of World War I and acknowledge the sacrifice and service of Lavaca County citizens. The one existing issue of this newspaper is damaged so some names might be unreadable or missing.

Column 9: Miscellaneous:

First 14: This individual was one of the first fourteen selective service men called to duty from Lavaca County, Texas. Please see additional information about these fourteen men on this website or contact the French Simpson Memorial Library in Hallettsville, Texas.
