Do All the Good You Can...

Rev. Jeremy T. Campbell Stated Clerk—Elizabeth Presbytery

"Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can."

—Not John Wesley

The quote above is often attributed to John Wesley, and while there is no evidence of him ever saying or writing it, its point is none the less important for us to take to heart. God offers us the invitation to be God's hands and feet, God's arms and heart, right where we are, and puts in our lives, and in our communities people who need us to show up on God's behalf.

We respond to God's invitation in lots of ways both as an individual and together, as a church. Sometimes, though, it is easy to lose sight of our impact, and as a result to feel small and powerless in the face of the great needs of the people and world around us.

As we prepare for the big football game coming up, I want to share with you a story of some Presbyterian teenagers who decided to respond to God's call. In 1989 a Presbyterian youth group in South Carolina was having a party for the big game. Now I wasn't there, but I have always had some southern food

envy, so I can image the spread they had prepared... Buffalo wings, seven layer dip, biscuits and gravy, probably one of those 6 foot subs and so on, a spread with all the trimmings. They asked one of the youth to offer a blessing on the meal before everyone dug in. As he began to pray the young man remembered some homeless folks he had seen on the way to the party and prayed "Dear God, as we enjoy this Super Bowl party help us to remember those who don't even have a bowl of soup to eat."

That idea stuck with the young man who offered the prayer, and with his youth group and the next year they decided to raise money for a local food pantry. That first year 1990, they raised about \$5,700 in cash and food donations. Word spread about this fun mission project and the youth got other churches in the presbytery involved and 22 churches participated. By 1994, the growth was exponential and churches from over 36 states got involved raising over a quarter of a million dollars in food and cash.

In 1998 for the first time, donations topped 1 million dollars, the next year they eclipsed 2 million and by 2001 three million was exceeded... over the next few years families for former presidents Bush and Carter, owners of some of the NFL Teams and an official Super Bowl Host Committee got

involved in the efforts. In 2008, just 10 years after reaching 1 million dollars and less than 20 years from the programs inception, donations for the year topped 10 Million dollars. In 2017 6,563 groups donated almost 5 million pounds of food along with almost 4.5 million dollars in cash donations to more than 4800 local food banks and hunger programs in their communities. Souperbowl of Caring is still led by an all youth board of directors.

Rev. Jeremy Campbell


Sermon title: I have called you by Name 1/13/2019





Five Ways God Uses Problems

Five Ways God Uses Problems

The problems you face will either defeat you or develop you - depending on how you respond to them. Unfortunately, most people fail to see how God wants to use problems for good in their lives. They react foolishly and resent their problems rather than pausing to consider what benefit they might bring.

Here are five ways God wants to use the problems in your life:

1. God uses problems to DIRECT you.

Sometimes God must light a fire under you to get you moving. Problems often point us in a new direction and motivate us to change. Is God trying to get your attention?

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart; and lean not unto your own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he will direct your paths. Proverbs 3:5-6

2. God uses problems to INSPECT you.

People are like tea bags... if you want to know what's inside them, just drop them into hot ever water! Has God tested your faith with a problem? What do problems reveal about you?

"When you have many kinds of troubles, you should be full of joy, because you know that these troubles test your faith, and this will give you patience." James 1:2-3

3. God uses problems to CORRECT you.

Some lessons we learn only through pain and failure. It's likely that as a child your parents told you not to touch a hot stove. But you probably learned by being burned. Sometimes we only learn the value of something by losing it.

"It is good for me that I have been afflicted; that I might learn thy statutes." Psalm 119:72

4. God uses problems to PROTECT you.

A problem can be a blessing in disguise if it prevents you from being harmed by something more serious. Last year a friend was fired for refusing to do something unethical that his boss had asked him to do. His unemployment was a problem - but it saved him from being convicted and sent to prison a year later when management's actions were eventually discovered.

"You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good" Genesis 50:20

5. God uses problems to PERFECT you.

Problems, when responded to correctly, are character builders. God is far more interested in your character than your comfort. Your relationship to God and your character are the only two things you're going to take with you into eternity.

"We can rejoice when we run into problems... they help us learn to be patient. And patience develops strength of character in us and helps us trust God more each time we use it until finally our hope and faith are strong and steady." Romans 5:3-4

Here's the point:

God is at work in your life - even when you don't recognize it or understand it. But it's so much easier when you surrender to his plan for your life.
