

Protect us our Lord before the end of life. Protects our children who drifted away and protect the lost youth, and the unfortunate troubled homes. Remember Lord the lonely. Remember Lord the addicts, the atheists and the apostates. Remember the stubborn. Remember the arrogant. Remember also the needy and the debtors. The ones who suffer and the prisoners. Remember Lord the poor within your people, the ill and the ones who live in sorrow. God, have mercy on all of us.

Remember Lord your traveling children. Remember Lord our holy gathering and all others. Remember Lord the President and religious leaders. Grant peace in our country. Remember Lord the widow and the orphan, the stranger, and the guest. Rectify our issues and those of our children, for the blessings of our mother St. Mary and all your saints. Listen to us Lord when we say with thanks - Our Father who is in heaven Hallowed be thy name... Amen.

Lessons On the Cross – The Fourth Saying

“I’m thirsty” was the fourth saying that Jesus said on the cross.

In our daily life, we meet people like this, who suffer for many reasons and need material help, money, or something else. They need a contribution, or they need spiritual help. They need a caress, and they need to be listened to and loved.

Jesus was like this also in his agony on the cross. He consumed all of his strength. The nails were perforating his hands and feet. The spun crown was hurting his head and his body needed rest. In his pain he begged and said: *“I’m thirsty”*. He was thirsty to love... to rest... thirsty to accomplish the will of his father. The soldiers wanted increase Jesus’s suffering by giving him the vinegar. If the soldiers, even all humanity had mercy of Jesus and offered water, would Jesus accept that offer? No, because we can read in the Gospel of Mark as it’s written in chapter 15 verses 22 and 23.

They brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha (which means *“the place of the skull”*). They gave him wine drugged with myrrh, but he didn’t take it. What can we understand from all this? Jesus doesn’t need our material help - neither the water nor the rest. He didn’t reject his suffering, but he wanted to handle his pain until death. Yes...until death the death on the cross.

Christ needed the hearts of the sinners and their love. I repeat, God only needs our hearts and our love. All these people who we meet every day are thirsty for love. They need someone listen to them when everyone who is around them are busy with the unreal world’s endless events. At times, people don’t ask for material needs, but they need the ears of our heart. Do you know that Jesus lives in these persons? Let’s us remember that He said, *“Every time you give one glass of cold water to one of these children, you give it to me”*. Therefore, I encourage you brother and sisters to lead your steps with faith to the suffering people and share their worries, listen to them, and heal their wounds.
