Este jueves el 3 de febrero es la fiesta de San Blas y como es el costumbre tendremos las bendiciones de las gargantas.



¿Puede un no católico recibir la comunión en la Misa católica? ¿Por qué sí o por qué no?

No, no se lo permite. Los no católicos no están en plena "comunión" con la Iglesia Católica en la creencia de que el pan y el vino se convierten en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo, muchos no católicos creen que es sólo simbólica, lo que no corresponde a la doctrina católica y por tanto no pueden recibirla.



### PARA TODA PAREJA: COMUNICACIÓN

"En el matrimonio, la habilidad para comunicarse adecuadamente es fundamental para que la relación sea estable y feliz. Y lo bueno es que

este es un arte que se puede aprender. La comunicación se compone de varios elementos: se necesita que haya una persona que tiene algo que decir y alguien que escuche el mensaje. A su vez, la calidad de mensaje dependerá de la claridad para comunicarse y de la disposición y habilidad del receptor por escuchar. Entre más específico, corto, directo y libre de interferencias sea el canal que usemos para comunicarnos, el mensaje se podrá escuchar más claramente. Por ejemplo, debemos poder decir: "Estoy molesta(o) porque ayer cuando te pregunté si podíamos planear unas vacaciones, me contestaste muy golpeado y de mala gana".



Igualmente, la retroalimentación que el que escucha le da al emisor es de gran ayuda para que la comunicación tenga éxito. Retroalimentar es parafrasear lo que usted escuchó o cree haber escuchado; por ejemplo puede decir: "O sea que tu estás molesta(o) porque ayer te pareció que te hablé golpeado y de mala gana". Si el receptor no ofrece esa retroalimentación o significado compartido, quizás el emisor pueda pedirle a la otra persona que le repita lo que cree que escuchó. Can a non-Catholic receive Communion at a Catholic Mass? Why or Why not?

Non-Catholics are not in full “communion” with the Catholic Church on the belief that the Bread and Wine become the Body and Blood of Christ; many non-Catholics believe it to be only symbolic and consequently are not permitted to receive.

What is the difference between the Immaculate Conception and the Virgin Birth of Jesus by Mary?

The Immaculate Conception teaching says Mary was kept free of original sin from the time of her conception. The Virgin Birth refers to Mary being a virgin when she gave birth to Jesus.

### Bishops: Israeli occupation a ‘scandal’



At the conclusion of a recent visit to the Holy Land, bishops from eight nations, including the United States,

faulted the Israeli occupation of the West Bank and Gaza saying: “For fifty years the West Bank, East Jerusalem and Gaza have languished under occupation, violating the human dignity of both Palestinians and Israelis. This is a scandal... many people in the Holy Land have spent their entire lives under occupation, with its polarizing social segregation... Now, more than ever, they deserve our solidarity.”

Continuing the Bishops stated: “We all have a responsibility to oppose the construction of settlements. This de facto annexation of land not only undermines the rights of Palestinians in areas such as Hebron and East Jerusalem but, as the UN recently recognized, also imperils the chance of peace.”

They then spoke of our responsibilities: “We all have a responsibility to provide assistance for the people of Gaza, who continue to live amid a man-made humanitarian catastrophe. They have now spent a decade under blockade, compounded by a political impasse caused by ill-will on all sides....

We all have a responsibility to promote a two-state solution. The Holy See has emphasized that “if Israel and Palestine do not agree to exist side-by-side, reconciled and sovereign within mutually agreed and internationally recognized borders, peace will remain a distant dream and security an illusion...”

They then added: “The Bible tells us: ‘You will declare this fiftieth year to be sacred and proclaim the liberation of all the country’s inhabitants’ (Leviticus 25:10). During this fiftieth year of occupation we must pray for the liberty of everyone in the Holy Land and practically support all those working to build a just peace.” (Source: European Bishops’ Conference; <http://catholic-ew.org.uk>)
